Miniature paintings will be on display

Whoever said that "good things come in small packages" would probably enjoy an art exhibition that will be taking place for three weeks in October in Shavertown. The Cider Painters of America will be holding their annual National Exhibit of miniature Art beginning October 7 at the Hefft House on Overbrook Road.

The Cider Painters are the new generation of Whiskey Painters, according to James Rogowski, the national chairman of cider painters. "The Whiskey Painters made works that were five inches by seven inches or smaller," said Rogowski. "As a next generation we wanted to go a bit smaller so our works are three by five or smaller.


