Rebecca Sorber is a member of the 1990 Mansfield University Women's Field Hockey team.

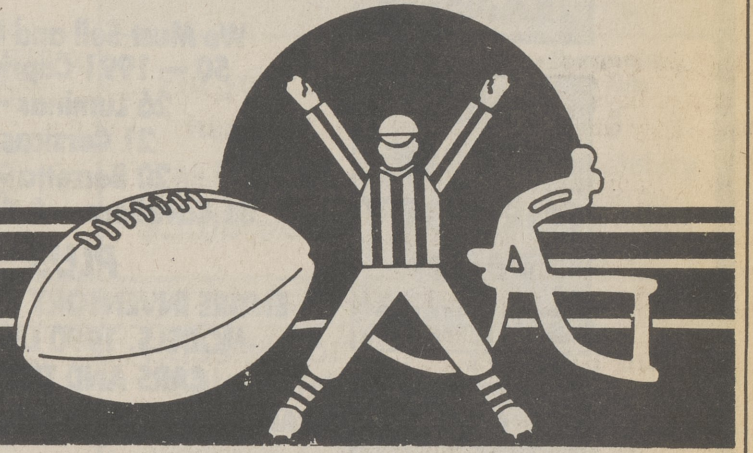
The freshmen from Dallas, Pa. is a forward for the lady Mountaineers. She is a graduate of Lake-Lehman High School.

Deer limits may be increased this season

Increased deer population and a large increase in deer damage experienced by farmers has caused the Pennsylvania Game Commission to approve the sale of a second bonus tag for antlerless (doe) deer for the 1990-1991 seasons.

If a county's allocation of regular antlerless licenses and first bonus tags has not been sold prior to November 13, a hunter may buy a second bonus tag in that county.

Properly licensed hunters will be permitted to shoot up to three deer. At least two of the deer must be antlerless and if the hunter does not shoot a buck and is properly licensed, he could shoot three antlerless deer.

The Game Commission also gave authority to the agency executive director to extend the antlerless season when and where necessary, especially on farms that have had extensive crop damage.

Farms where extended antlerless deer hunting is allowed will be posted by the farmers. The Game Commission will have highly visible indicating crop damaged farms printed and distribute them. A list of such farms will be posted by regional offices and when necessary the Game Commission will help direct hunters who qualify to the farm locations.

Deer are a valuable natural resource which can be maintained indefinitely where they have suitable habitat. They are a valuable public asset in many areas because they attract hunters and wildlife watchers which can mean significant revenues, especially in many rural communities.

Management of the deer herd means controlling the size of the deer population and this control can only be done by harvesting female deer. This is accomplished in Pennsylvania by having regulated antlerless deer seasons. There are restrictions on the number of deer a hunter may shoot, number of licenses issued in a given county, and the length and number of seasons used to control the harvest as well as the ability of the forest habitat to support the size of the deer herd during the winter.
