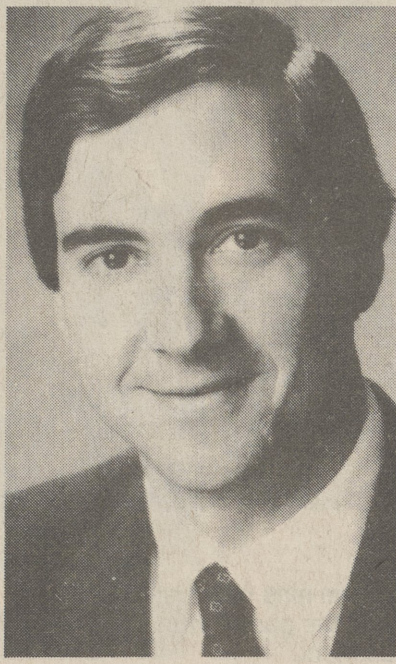

Jacobs named to faculty at Ashland University

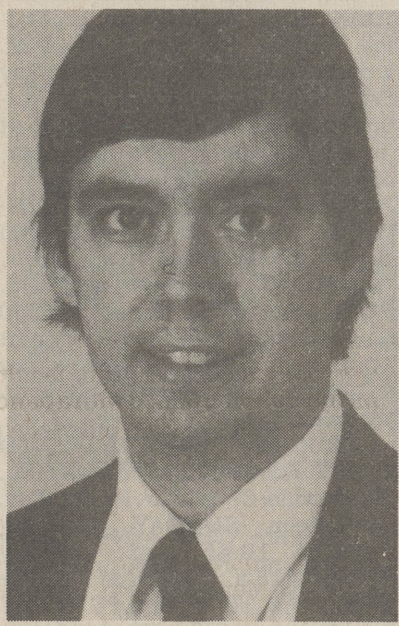
Dallas native Dr. Raymond A. Jacobs, associate professor of business administration, has been named to the faculty in the School of Business Administration and Economics at Ashland University.

He and his wife, Karen E. Stine, who teaches in AU's School of Sciences, reside in Ashland with their two children.

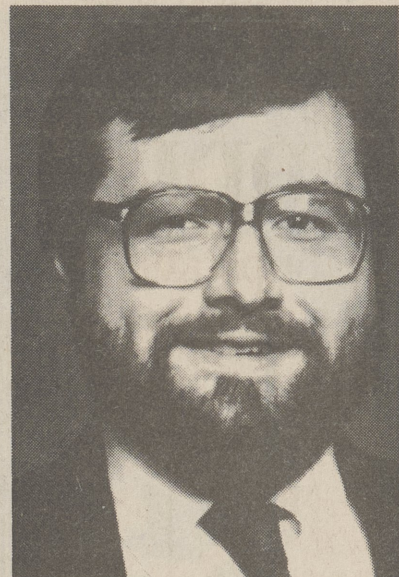
David Schappert named to administrative staff at LCCC

Misericordia employees honored for many years of employment

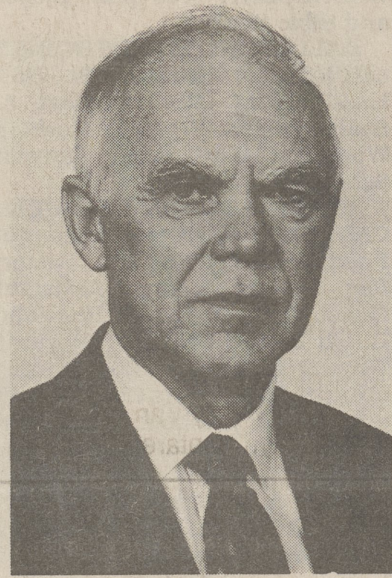

Pearsall to chair Boy Scout dinner

The dinner is held each year to raise supplemental funds for the local Boy Scout Council. Council President Eugene J. Kane, Sr. of Kane Trucking and Warehousing, said this year's goal is \$125,000. Kane said the money is used to supplement funding from local United Ways to provide for the services to more than 10,000 youth and 2,400 adult volunteers.
