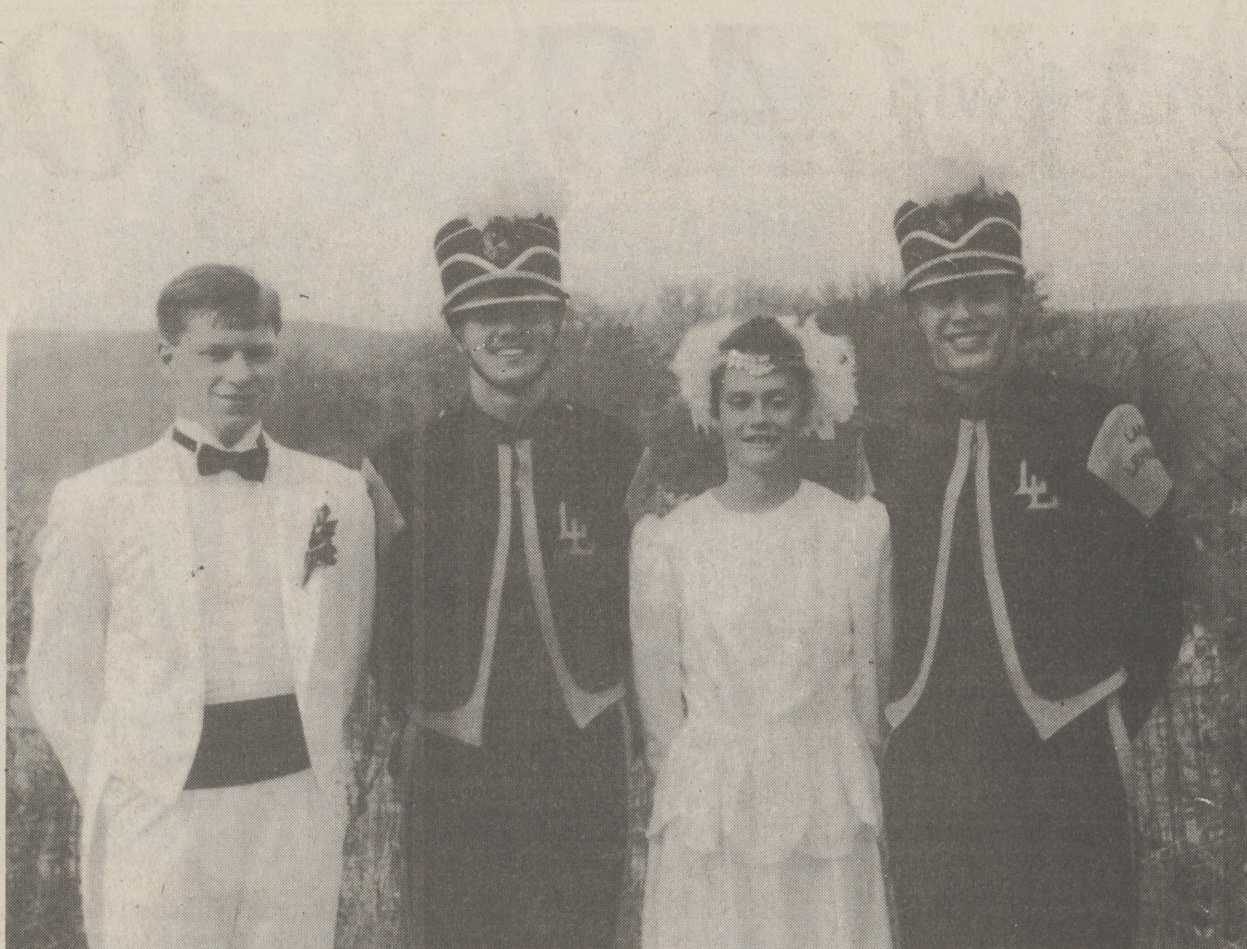
Literary editor and former Sports editor of the Opinator, the school newspaper, Kellman has also been active in Seminary's Orientation Committee, and acts as a student tour guide.
