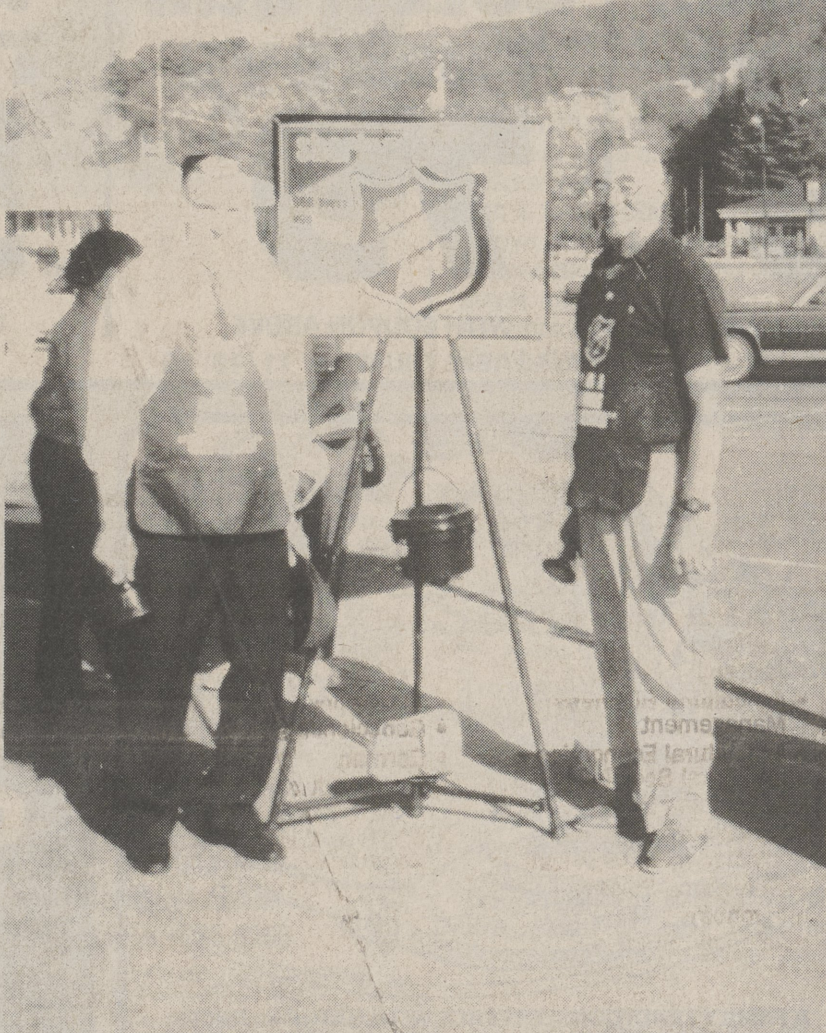
Artisans featured at craft sale
