Dr. Buzinkai chosen for C-Span seminar program

Dr. Donald Buzinkai, professor and chairperson of government and politics at King's College, was one of 35 college and university instructors in the nation recently to attend C-SPAN's Summer 1990 Seminar for Professors, held in Washington, D.C.

Chosen through a competitive application process, Dr. Buzinkai was among 2,100 college level members of "C-SPAN in the Classroom" (the cable television network's free national membership organization for educators) invited to apply.

The two-day seminar included professional roundtables; discussions and workshops; participation in a live, nationally televised viewer call-in program, and a reception at the National Press Club. The seminar focused on issues relating to educational uses of C-SPAN's public affairs programs. Topics included "Video as a Teaching Medium", "C-SPAN's Application by Academic Discipline", and "Focus on Programming".

C-SPAN, a non-profit public affairs cable television network, is available in 50.3 million households nationwide and around the world via satellite. It is privately funded and is a public service of the cable television industry. C-SPAN was created in 1979 to provide coverage of the U.S. House of Representatives. Today, it offers numerous public events from the nation's capital and across the country 24 hours a day.

Dr. Buzinkai, a Shavertown resident, earned his B.A. from St. Francis College, and his M.A. and Ph. D. from New York University.

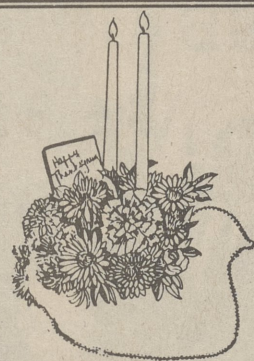
