

'Camelot' to be performed at Music Box

The Music Box Players will present the Lerner and Loewe musical classic: "Camelot," Nov. 30, Dec. 1, 2, 6 to 9 and 13 to 16. This famous tale of King Arthur and his mythical kingdom is based on the T.H. White novel: "The Once and Future King," and was first presented on Broadway in 1961 with Richard Burton and Julie Andrews and most recently with Richard Harris as King Arthur. Since its first performance, "Camelot" has become one of America's most beloved musicals and boasts one of the lovliest scores in Broadway history including the songs: "If Ever I Would Leave You" and the title song, "Camelot".
