The library staff Christmas Stocking project is going along well with 125 red stockings now adding to the Christmas decor, hanging in the library. A stocking may be purchased for \$1.00 and the patron then signs their name and enters a wish on the stocking and we hang it up. We will send these wishes to the North Pole in time for the wishes to be seen by Santa Claus. We could use few more red stockings to add to our decora-

tions.

The Friends Book Tree project is also doing well. To date, 20 people have donated their \$5.00 signed their name on the special ornament card and hung the card on the Christmas Tree, specifically designated for the book ornaments. After Christmas, this money will be used to purchase some new and special books for the library shelves. There are more cards ready and waiting for signatures in a Santa Sleigh near the special tree.

There are many brand new children's books just arrived in the Children's Room at the library, including, "Max Makes a Million" by Maira Kalman, a very popular children's editor. This story is about

Max's dream to live in Paris and be a poet. Max lives in New York City and he is a dog.

"Hattie and the Wild Waves" by Barbara Cooney is a story with grace and gentle humor from the neighborhoods of Brooklyn to the seascapes of Long Island. A testament to life and art, and to one child who had the courage to make a life in art. Hattie loved to paint the wild waves.

"I Went Walking" by Sue Williams is a young child's book and a boy's exciting adventure with a menagerie of colorful animals. By the end of his walk, he has a zany parade following him. The whimsical paintings lend a touch of humor to the simple and educational story.


