Safety seats being modified

On November 1, 1990, Fisher-Price announced that it is offering modifications to approximately 975,000 child safety seats. The seats were manufactured from April 1985 through August 1985 and from May 1987 through January 1989.

The child safety seats produced between April and August of 1985, Model No. 9100, contain shields which may break during use. Some car seats produced from May 1987 to January 1989, Models Nos. 9100 and 9101, may have shields that are difficult to latch because of a cracked plastic part on the inside of the buckle.

Though it is not recalling the safety seats, Fisher-Price is providing new shields to consumers who own the defective car seats. In addition, the button located on the shoulder belt can be removed. Consumers have reported that some children have placed the button in their mouths.
