LCCC offers graduate school preparation program

Area residents preparing for graduate school, or planning to attend graduate school in the near future, will have the opportunity to be better prepared for the entrance examination by attending a comprehensive program of study offered by the Continuing Education Division at Luzerne County Community College.

Courses geared specifically for the Graduate Record Exam (GRE),

Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT), and the Law School Admissions Test (LSAT) will be offered throughout the Spring semester at the community college.

Each course will consist of four sessions each, and will be held on Saturdays, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the LCCC Educational Conference Center.

Students preparing to take the Graduate Record Exam for test dates March 16 and June 1, 1991, can take the GRE Course on March 15 through April 19 and May 4 through May 25, 1991.

MBA candidates preparing to take the Graduate Management Admissions Test for test dates March 16 and June 15, 1991, can take the GMAT Course on February 16 through March 9, and May

18 through June 8, 1991.

A law school applicant planning to take the Law School Admissions Test for test dates February 9 and June 10, 1991 (tentative), can prepare by taking the LSAT Course on January 12 through February 2, and May 11 through June 8, 1991.
