Knight grapplers pin Meyers to stay at top of division

Last season the Black Knights of Lake-Lehman wrestled to a well-fought tie with the Meyers, but this year the Knights used the final three bouts to pull out a 31-25 win over the Mohawk squad. The win kept the Knights on top of the West Division of the Wyoming Valley Conference.

"We knew our kids could win but we also knew it could come down to the last bout, which meant a lot of pressure on the final wrestlers. But we felt they could handle it," said coach Phil Lipski.

Co-coaches Lipski and Williams knew it was going to be a tough close match between the two teams and they were elated when their lightweight grapplers came through with enough points to keep the match close. But with the Mohawks leading 25-16 going into the 171 bout the Knights knew they had to take the final bouts to guarantee a win.

171 Terry Martin took a major 10-2 decision from Mohawk Dan Jones and 189 Mike Geurin won a technical foul over Mohawk Tom Kerpovich in 5:58.

With the score tied at 25, it was then up to Hwt. Ray Rosencrans who pinned Mohawk Don Rau in 5:54.

Both the Knights and the Mohawks have strong teams and Meyers Coach Bill Hilburt knew it going into the match. The Mohawks won six bouts, the Knights won seven.

The key meet in the match seemed to be the 152-lb. bout where Knight Mike Tereska took a 3-2 decision from Meyers Chris Edwards.

The Knights took the 119 bout when Charlie Roper pinned Dan Harris in 3:03, 135-lb. bout with Charlie Jacoby taking a major 14-1 decision from Matt Fraley, 145-lb. bout with Jason Naugle decisioned Keith Burritt 14-1, the 152lb. bout with Mike Tereska taking a 3-2 decision from Chris Edwards and the final three bouts, 171, 189 and Hwt.


