Gate of Heaven registration scheduled for Jan. 28-31

Mrs. Mary Tighe, Principal, announces that in conjunction with Catholic Schools Week, kindergarten and first to eighth grade registration will be held on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Jan. 28, 29, 30, 31 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the school lobby on the first floor.

Children entering kindergarten in September, 1991, must be five years of age before September 30, 1991.

Information needed at this time includes child's social security number and proof of immunization. Eligibility immunizations are 3 DPT, 3 oral polio, and the following vaccines administered at 12 months or older: measles, mumps, rubella. Parents must present all records of child's immunization in compliance with state standards for immunizations.

Birth certificate and baptismal record are also required; non-Catholic students need only present birth certificate, social security number and immunization records.

A non-refundable registration fee of \$100 must be paid at registration time.

Parents who cannot register within these stated dates, may call the school office at 675-6566 or 675-2121 to make an appointment to register your child.

Prospective kindergarten parents may visit the kindergarten classrooms on Monday, Jan. 28, from 9-11 a.m.

On Wednesday, Jan. 31, Gate of Heaven School will celebrate National Appreciation Day for Catholic Schools beginning with the 9 a.m. children's liturgy and followed by open house from 10-11 a.m.

Dallas child development class begins nursery school projects

The Child Development classes at the Dallas Senior High School are developing the projects and activities for the Nursery School to be conducted by them in conjunction with their studies. Parents of children who became three years old before January 1, 1991, or four years old before January 1, 1991, who wish to have their children participate in the project may register the child at the Senior High School office between 9 a.m. and 12 noon as soon as possible.

Sixteen children from each age group will be accepted on a first come basis. The children and parents must be residents of the Dallas School District.

The three year olds will attend Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings beginning February 5 until March 21. The four year olds will participate Tuesday,

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday mornings from April 9 through May 17 except April 10 and May 2.

The project runs from 9 a.m. until 11:05 a.m. The calendar and times for each session will be available at registration time. The above schedule is subject to change and vacations in the regular school calendar. Some time changes will be announced as school activities require.

Transportation will be the responsibility of the family.

The children will participate in group and individual activities, story hour, snacks, crafts, music and science activities and lessons, as well as free play times. Additional information will be provided at the time of registration. The Nursery School Project is under the direction of Mrs. Nancy Goeringer, Child Development teacher.
