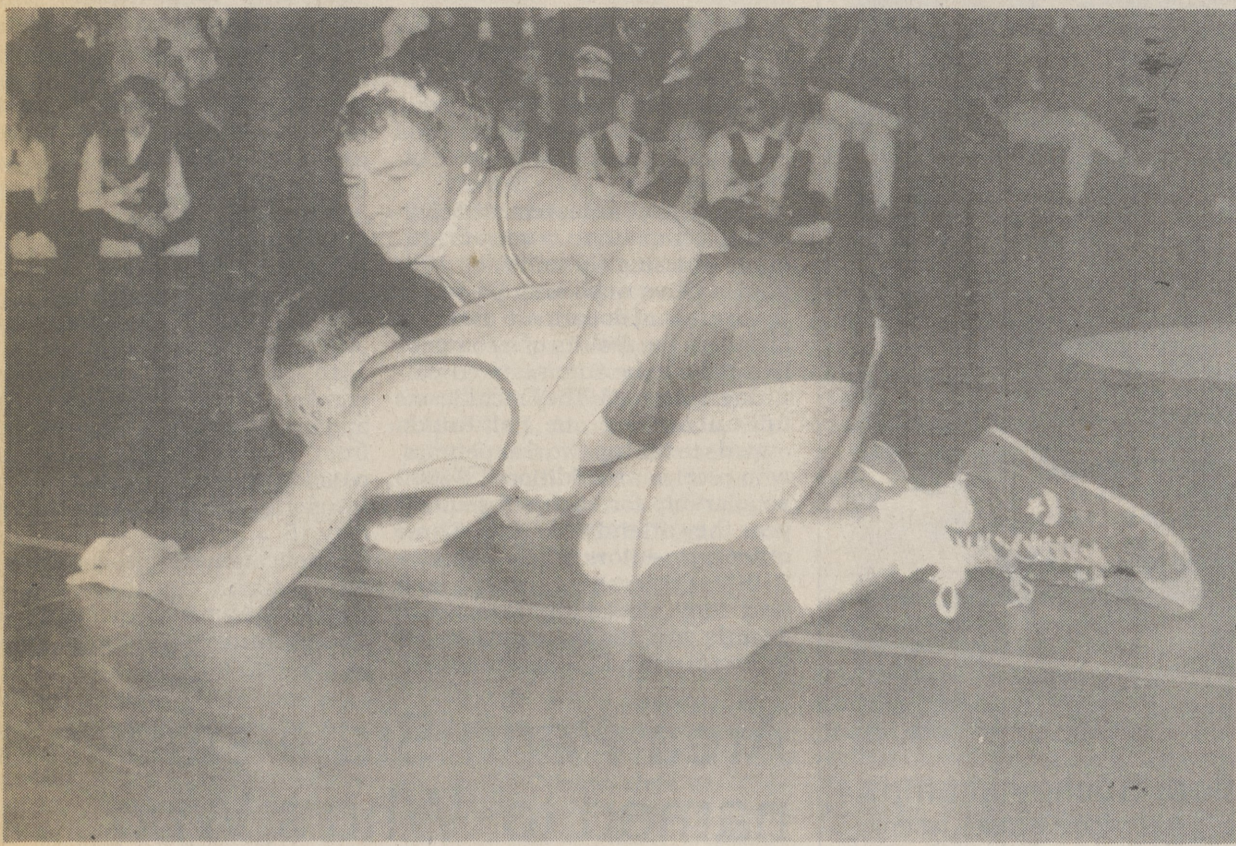
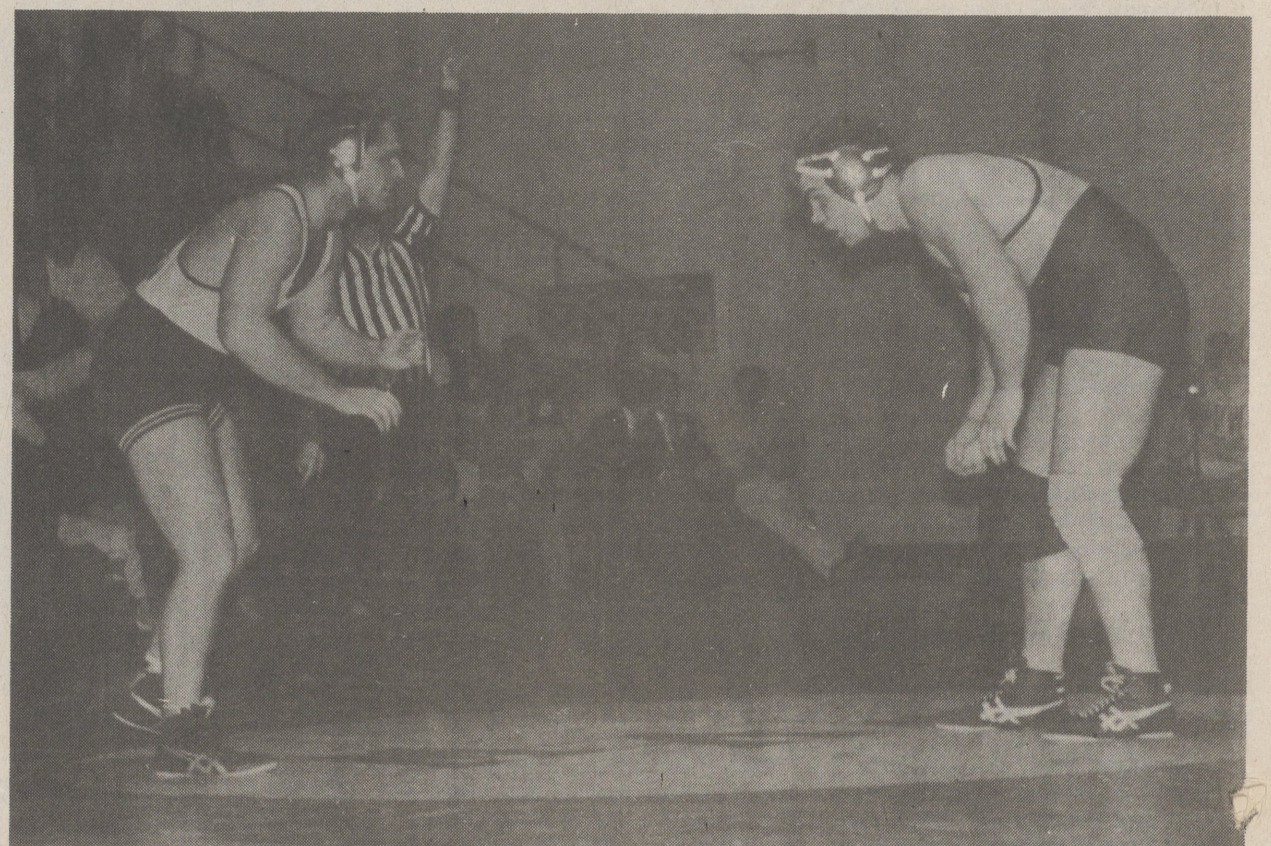

## Black Knights pin Valley West to stay unbeaten

The Lake-Lehman wrestlers won the battle of the unbeaten Saturday night, handing Wyoming Valley West a convincing 44-21 defeat on the Spartans' mats. The victory gave the Knights a 6-0 record and virtually assured a league title, since their next league opponent is winless West Side Tech. The Knights used five pins and a technical fall to pace the win.

The Spartans opened the match with an 8-3 decision over 103 Jon Morgan and a major 12-2 decision over Jesse Sorber.

The Black Knights came back with six points when 119 Charlie Roper pinned J.J. Vassello in 1:05

but the Spartans moved in front 13-6 when their 125 John Krakowski flattened Jason McDade in 5:04.

The Black Knights lost no time in moving ahead when 130 Charlie Jacoby wrestled to a technical fall over John Doyle in 4:44 and 135 Rich Peiffer took a major 14-5 decision from Jim Williams.

140 Spartan Doug Giza took a 12-5 decision from Dave Konopke but the Knights clinched the match by winning the next five bouts on pins by 145 Mike Tereska, 160 Terry Martin, 171 Mike Geurin, 189 Ray Rosencrans and a technical fall by 152 Jason Naugle.

Hwt. Spartan Pat Phillips gave his team their final six points with a technical fall over Gary Masters.

Wednesday night the Knights met the Coughlin Crusaders, leaders in East Division with the same 7-0 record and came away with a 32-23 win over the Crusaders when the Knights heavier weights came through with two decisions, a major decision, a technical fall and a pin in the final five bouts.

The Crusaders took four of the first five bouts of the meet but then the heavier weights took over winning seven of the final eight, with 135 Charlie Jacoby bringing the standing room only crowd to their feet when he pinned Pete Hoskins in 1:39.

The Knights host Hanover Wednesday night and West Side Tech Friday night.

## Dallas grapplers pick up first win

The young Dallas Mountaineers picked up their first win in the Wyoming Valley Wrestling League Saturday night when they defeated West Side Tech 63-10 on the Titans' mats.

103 lb. Rich Hodle, 125 Bob Jesse, 145 Glen Ellsworth and Hwt. Dave Golem won for the Mountaineers on forfeits and 112 Eric Williams pinned his opponent in :54; 130 Frank Natitus gave Dallas a pin by flattening his man in 3:49; 152 Chris Updyke added a fall in :50; 162 Jamie Walsh pinned his opponent in 1:06; and 171 Heath Williams added a pin in :35. Other wins were from 112 Harry Phillips who turned in a major 15-0 decision; 135 Jon Pomrinke who earned a technical fall 16-0 from his oppo-

onent. Lone wins for the Titans were 140 Justin Hufford's 11-0 major decision and 189 Lou Wruble's 38-second pin over his opponent.

Earlier in the week the Mountaineers lost a 38-25 match to the Nanticoke Trojans.

The Trojans 103 Ziggy Januszewski put six points on the board by flattening his Dallas opponent in 3:09. In the next bout 113 Eric Williams gave Dallas three points by taking an 8-1 decision from Dave Yakavonis.

Brothers 119 Brian Lukaszewski flattened Harry Phillips in 1:59 and 125 Joe Lukshewski took a major 12-1 decision from Bob Jesse to put the Trojans in front 16-3 and Dallas never went ahead the rest of the match.

130 Mount Frank Natitus defeated Dave Steevers 3-2 but 135 Joe Deluca won by default over

Mount Jon Pomrinke and 140 Bob Vitall overturned Bob Wright in :49.

145 Mount Glen Ellsworth pinned Trojan Bob Smith in 3:58 then 152 John Kashutus decided Mount Chris Updyke 13-6 and 171 Jeremy Kashutus took a superior 18-2 decision from Heath Williams. 189 Trojan Mike Roberts wrestled to a 6-6 draw with Dallas' Jamie Oley.

160 Jamie Walsh flattened Trojan Tony Carmen in 4:58 and Hwt. Dave Golem pinned Trojan Chris Landmesser in 1:38.

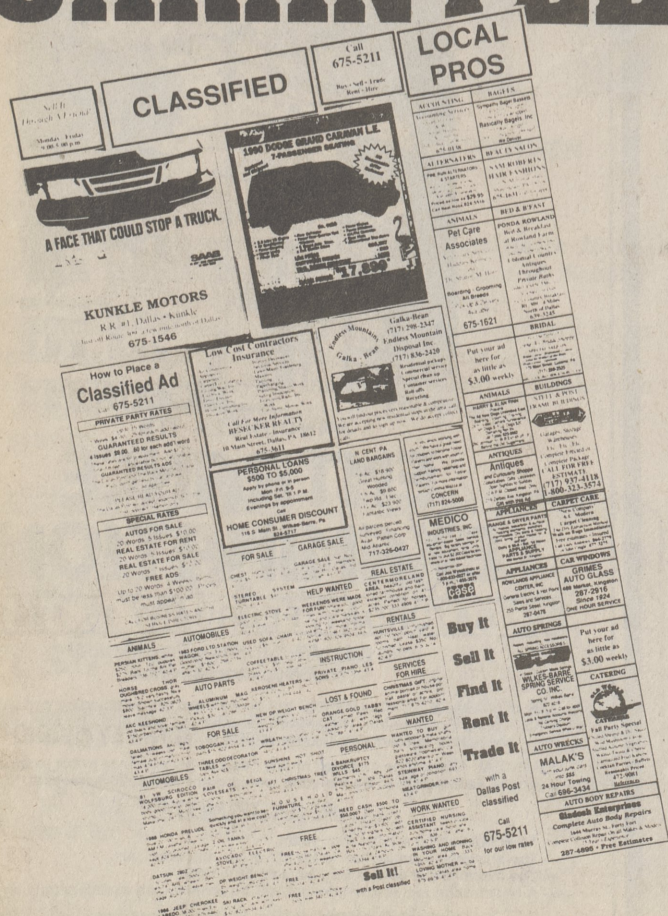
