Dallas boys' second-half record falls to 3-3 after two losses

After losing only once in the first half of the season, the Dallas boys cagers dropped two of three games last week to even their second-half record at 3 and 3. The Mounts were beaten by Wyoming Seminary and Seton Catholic, teams they defeated in the first half with no evident difficulty. The Mountaineers lost 65-64 to Seton Catholic Saturday night on their home court. Seton's Dan Noone scored a game high 30 points, including eight three-point-

ers. Damon Lisnow hit 14 points for the Mountaineers, Mark Medura tossed in 13 and Dave Puz and Ray Russin each scored 12 in the losing effort. The Mountaineers defeated Lake-Lehman 65-49 Thursday night paced by Lisnow's 26 points. Medura added 16 points for the Mountaineers, one of his goals a three-pointer. Rick Davis paced the Knights with 20 points, including a three-pointer and Tony Strauser added 14 points for the Knights. Russin and Lisnow combined

for 51 points in Tuesday night's game with Wyoming Seminary on the Blue Knights floor, but double figure scoring by four of the Blue Knights for a total of 61 points which was a key factor in their going ahead in the final quarter to edge out the Mountaineers 69-67 for the win. Lisnow hit 29 points in the game putting in 14 goals from the field and going one-for-two from the foul line. Russin scored 22 points, six of them on three-pointers. This week Dallas was to travel to Bishop Hafey Tuesday and host West Side Tech Friday night.

Black Knights lose to Mounts 65-49

Rick Davis was high scorer for the Knights with 20 points, putting the ball through the nets seven times from the field, one a three-pointer and going five-for-eight from the free throw stripe. Troy Strauser added 14 points, eight

from the field and six-for-eight from the charity stripe. Bob Jones gave the Knights five points, one of the goals a three-pointer. Earlier in the week, the Knights dropped a 62-51 game to Bishop O'Reilly after holding the Queensmen to nine points in the first quarter. The Queensmen rallied in the second period and scored 22 points to tie the game at 31-31 at the end of the first half. They came out strong in the second half and held the Knights to only 20 points while

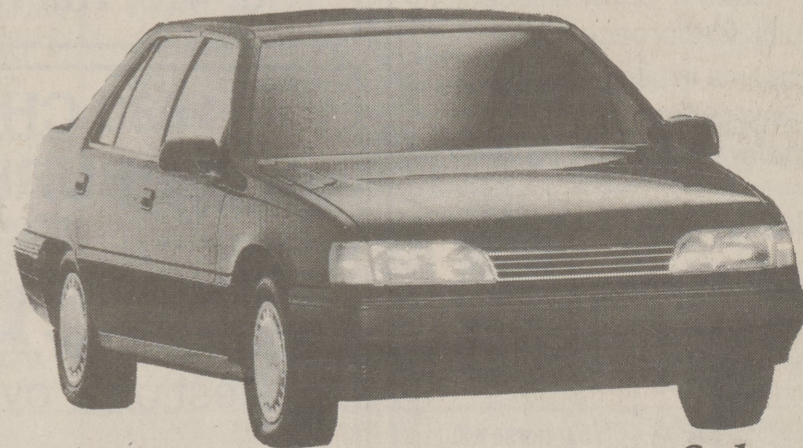

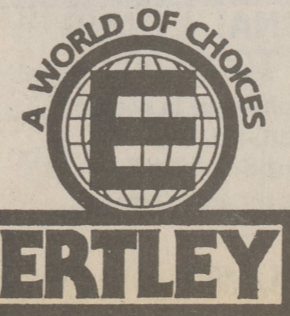
