Smith hit eight shots from the field and went 2-for-5 from the foul line and Davis scored five times from the field and had 3-for-5 from the free throw stripe.

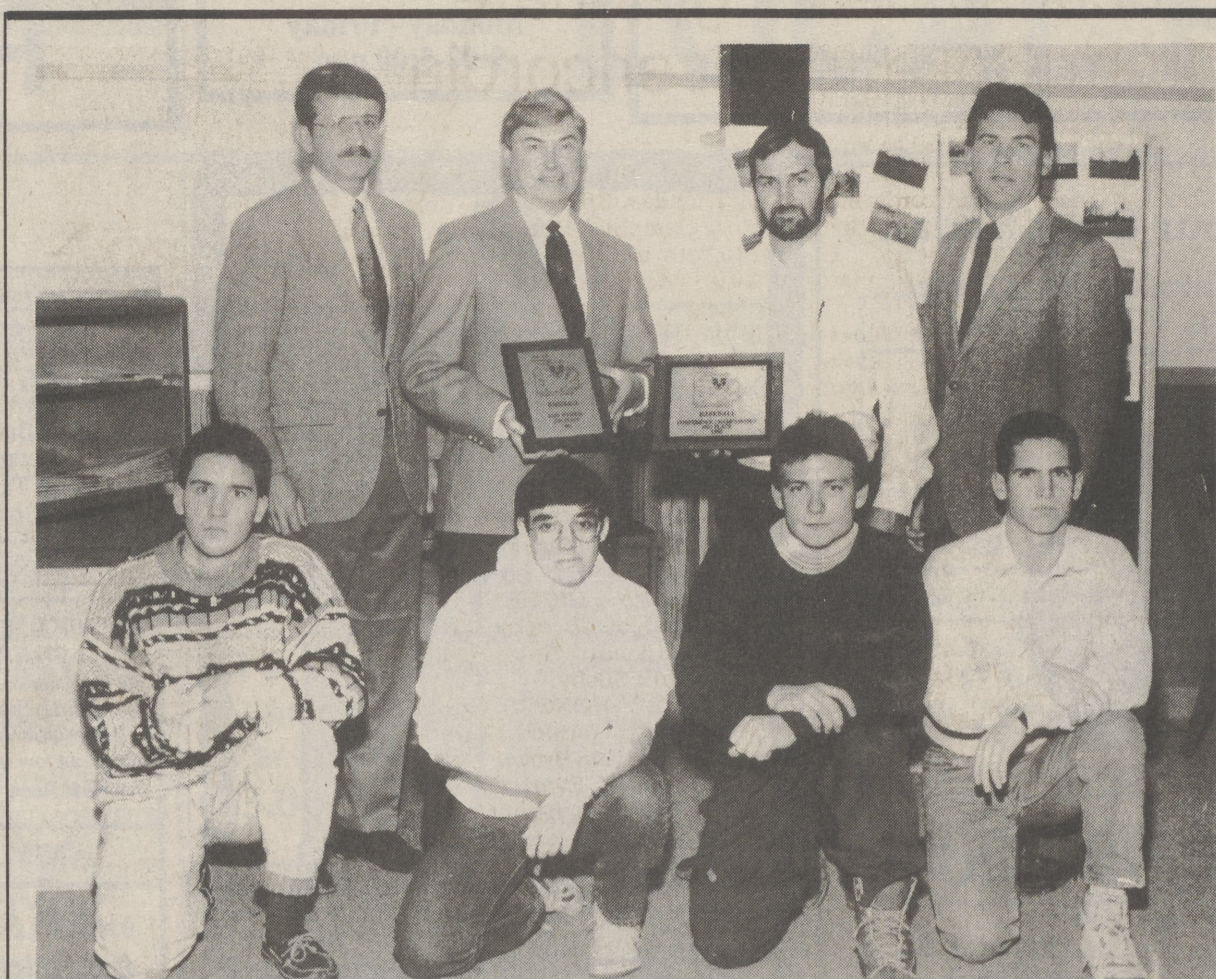
The Lady Knights play at Northwest Thursday night in their final game of the second half.

Black Knight grapplers romp over No. 4 Line Mountain

Line Mountain picked up three points when their 135 Bob Renn decided Rich Peiffer 9-5 and 140 Darin Keim added six points to make it 15 when he took a technical fall from Justin Goodwin.

Knight Mike Tereska decision his 145 opponent Dave Dowman 4-1 for three points but 152 Ryan Heim picked up three for Line Mountain by taking Jason Naugle 9-5.
