Unbeaten Knight grapplers gear up for district meet

It will be a "dog fight" between the Lake-Lehman Knights and Meyers for the title in this weekend's Class AA, District 2 wrestling tournament, according to Knights coach Phil Lipski.

"We defeated Meyers by only five points last year and they have a well-balanced team this season," Lipski said last week.

Returning champions from Lake-Lehman are Dave Konopke, Mike Geurin and Ray Rosencrans, as well as several favorites such as Terry Martin, Jason McDade, Mike Tereska, Charlie Jacoby and Charlie Roper.

The Knights' biggest threat will be the Mohawks who have two champions returning; Mike Toney and Chris Edwards. Mark Ber-

nardo, Matt Fraley, Jesse Grillith and several others also are tough competitors.

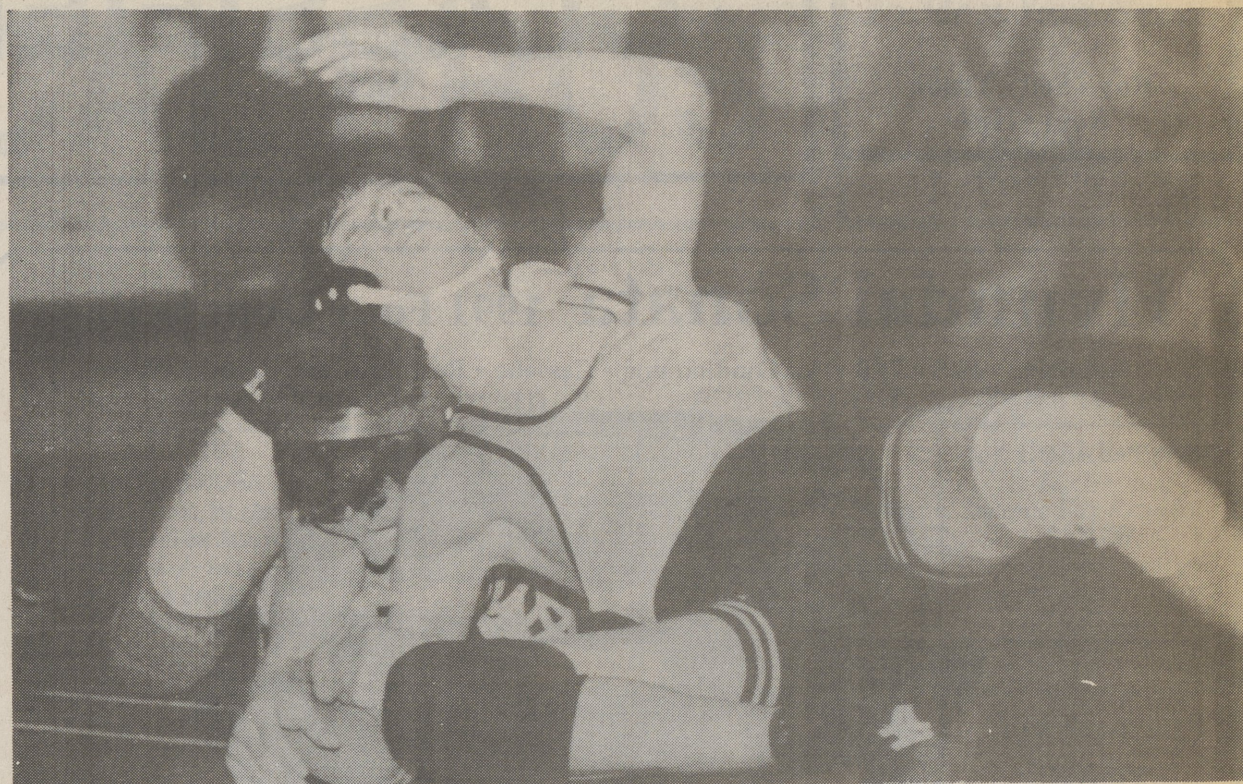
The Knights and Mohawks will probably come head to head in the finals and the team with the most points picked up in the semi-finals will probably be the team to win. There are fewer points to be picked up in the finals so it's necessary to add up the points in the preliminaries, quarter-finals and semi-finals.

Lipski released a list of the Black Knights who will compete depending on wrestlers making weight or some eliminations. The lineup includes John Morgan 103, outside chance to place; Jesse Sorber 112, a shot at placing; Charlie Roper 119, favorite; Jason McDade 125, place winner; Charlie Jacoby 130, favorite; Rich Peiffer 135, favorite; Dave Konopke or Justin

Goodwin 140, Konopke a returning champ, Goodwin, could advance; Mike Tereska 145, favorite; Jason Naugle 152, favorite; Terry Martin 160, runnerup, could take his class; Mike Geurin, returning champ, could repeat; Ray Rosencrans 189, regional champ, could repeat; and George Kocher, Hwt., replacing Gary Masters., who was injured; lacks experience but if wrestles well could place.

"It will be a close fight between Meyers and Lake-Lehman," Lipski said. "At least we expect it to be but it remains to be seen."

The teams in the Class AA division include Bishop Hoban, Crestwood, Dallas, GAR, Hanover, Lake-Lehman, Meyers, West Side Tech, Luzerne County; Bishop O'Hara, Scranton Prep and Valley View, Lackawanna County.

Terry Martin: just one of unbeaten Lake-Lehman's outstanding wrestlers

Lake-Lehman wrestling coaches Phil Lipski and Tom Williams are counting on senior Terry Martin to be among the wrestlers who help bring home a win to Lake-Lehman next weekend from the District 2 competition this weekend.

Martin, who has been wrestling for the past eight years, began his mat career in the Noxen Elementary program. When he was in junior high at Lake-Lehman he wrestled lightweight until he moved up to ninth grade and advanced to the upper weights.

An outstanding athlete, Martin is known to many Back Mountain sports fans for his excellent play for the Knights football team, helping lead the 1990 team to its most successful season in years.

"In my sophomore year I wrestled at 140 under Coach Ed Ladamus," Martin said. "In my junior year I wrestled 145 and 152 and finished

second in districts to advance to regionals, but I didn't make it to states," he stated.

This year he has been wrestling at 160 and 171 but his preferred weight is 160.

"My goal this year is to go as far as possible and at least place in states. I've been doing weight lifting on my own to keep in shape," Martin said. He gives a lot of credit for the team's success to the coaches. "They get us up for our matches long before the matches are coming up and they know how to move the lineup around for the big meets," he said.

Martin was surprised that the Line Mountain match wasn't closer but he said when the Knights were winning in the lighter bouts and the team was leading when it got to his bout, he was sure they would win.

Despite his outstanding performance in wrestling, Martin's favorite sport is football. He played for six years on Lake-Lehman

teams as a back, starting in seventh grade.

"I liked football since I was a kid," Martin said. "I had three older brothers who played football and cousins who came over to our place and we would play," he explained.

The son of Alfred and Deatra Martin of Loyalville, Martin has two older brothers, Al and Dave who wrestled for Lake-Lehman who helped spark Terry's interest in the sport.

He also likes golf and used to play baseball as catcher. Martin plans to attend college, hopefully Clarion or East Stroudsburg and play football. He is undecided on his major.

Sports are a family affair; Martin's younger brother, Keith, is interested in wrestling and a sister Rachealle cheers for mini-football.

With a record of 20-5 in his senior year, Martin expects to go into this weekend's competition at 160 unless his coaches decide differently.
