Roberts, a native of the Back Mountain, has resided in Dallas for the past 30 years. He is a graduate of Dallas High School and King's College and is a member of the faculty in the Dallas School District.

He and his wife are the parents of a son, Doug and a daughter, Alycia.

"I have been following the Dallas Borough Council for the past several years and I decided I would like to give something back to the community where my family and I reside.

"If elected I would be interested in carrying out things that need to be done. I am interested in seeing our recreation park continue as it has been for years. I would also like to be certain that the recycling program is carried out," said Roberts.

The terms of four council members expire this year. They are Harold Brobst, Jerry Machell, Donald Shaffer and Robert Brown, who was appointed to fill the seat left vacant by Russell Eyet's resignation.

It is reported that Brown is running for nomination in the May Primary although he is in Florida and the report could not be confirmed. Machell, Shaffer and Brobst have said they are not seeking reelection.

A Jackson Township fireman is out of the hospital after suffering problems from smoke inhalation while fighting a fire last week.

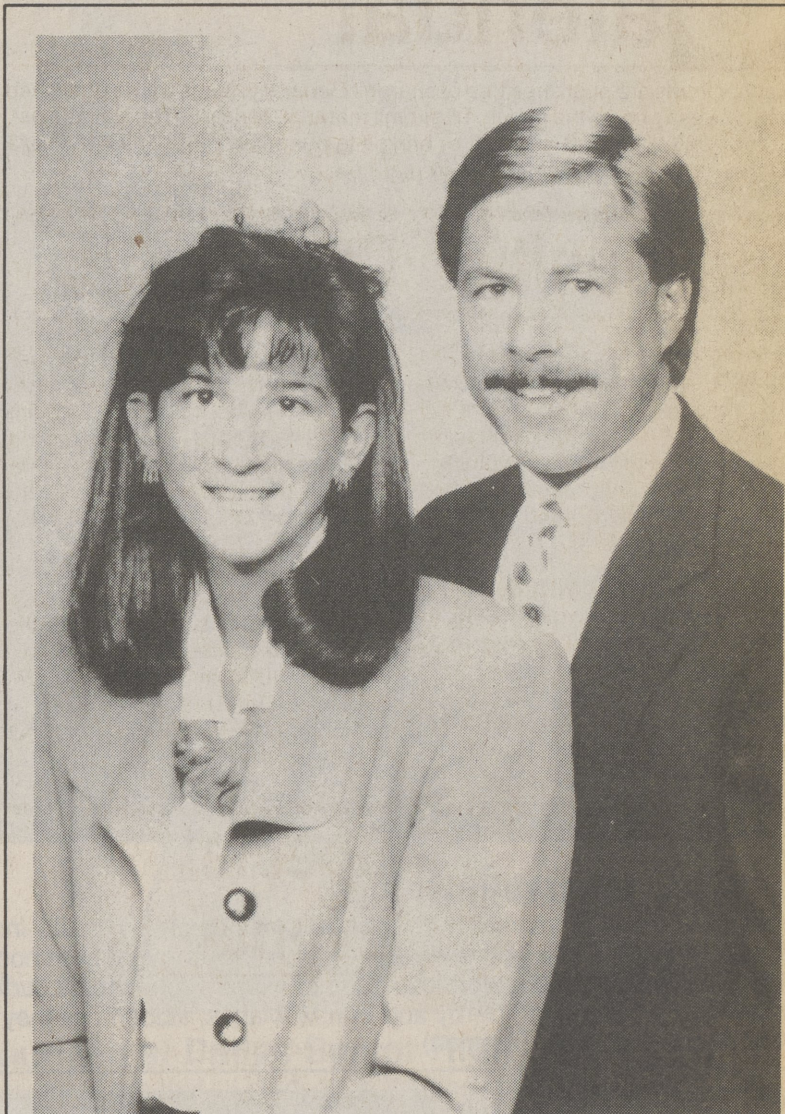
Dave Nemetz was hospitalized and treated for smoke inhalation while battling the blaze which destroyed a summer home near the Ceasetown Dam March 6.

According to Jackson Township Fire Chief Rolly Evans, the blaze

occurred at a one-story cottage owned by Al Nehme. Evans said that when fire crews arrived at the scene the front porch of the building was fully involved in flames.

Fire fighters from Jackson Township, Trucksville and Lake Silkworth eventually brought the blaze under control.

Evans said that Nemetz was fighting the fire when he was overcome by smoke and taken to the hospital by Jackson Township Ambulance personnel.
