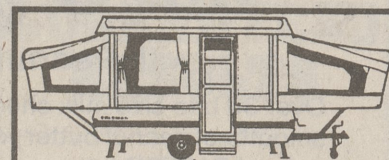
Audubon Society to meet Mar. 18
