## Oh named Lion's Club student of the month

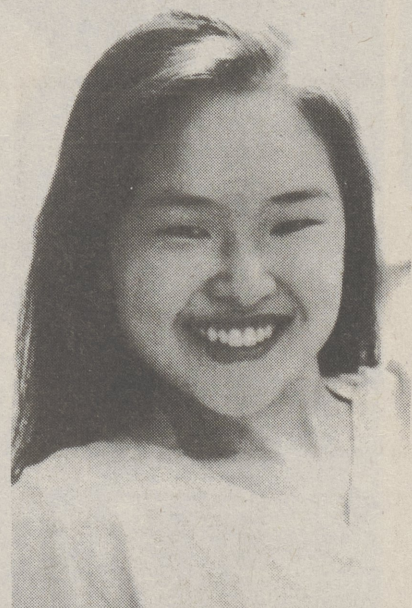
