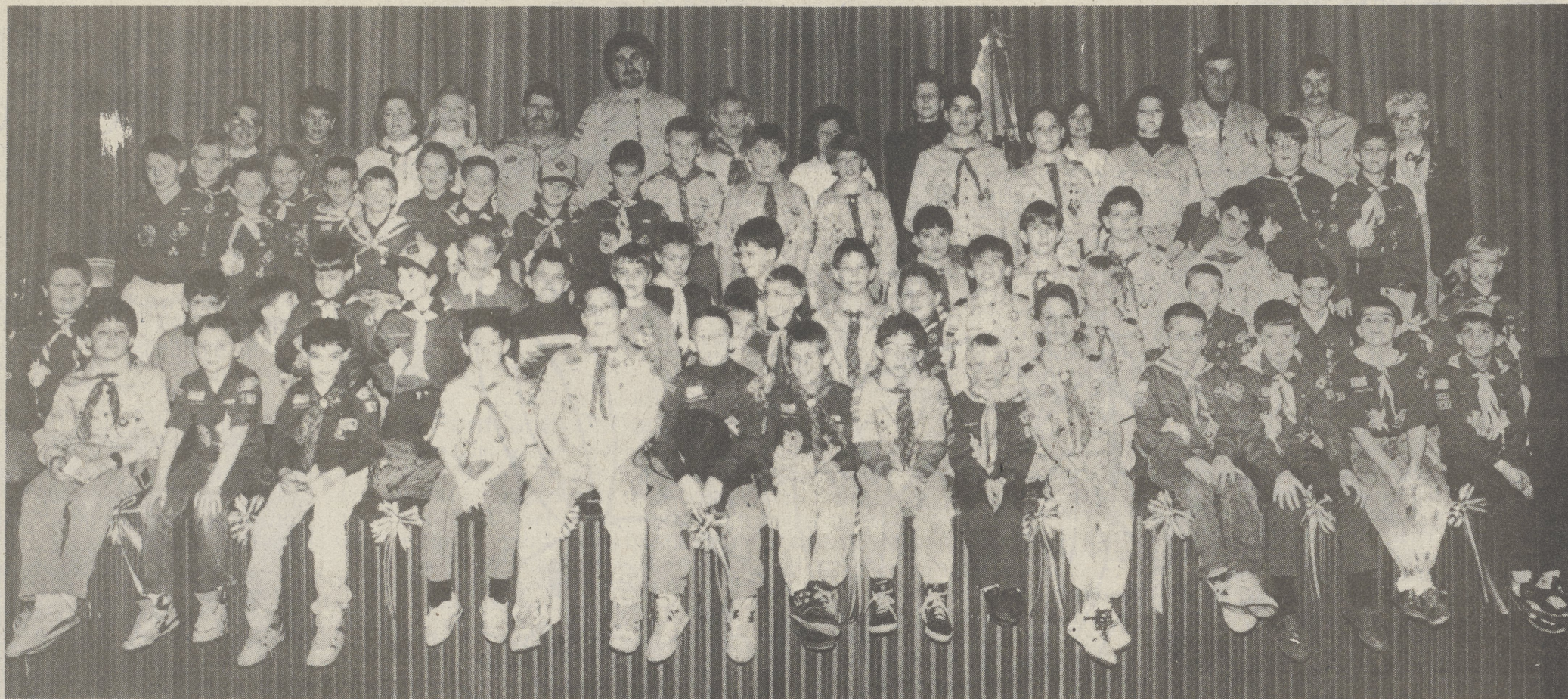
LaLeche League starts meetings March 20

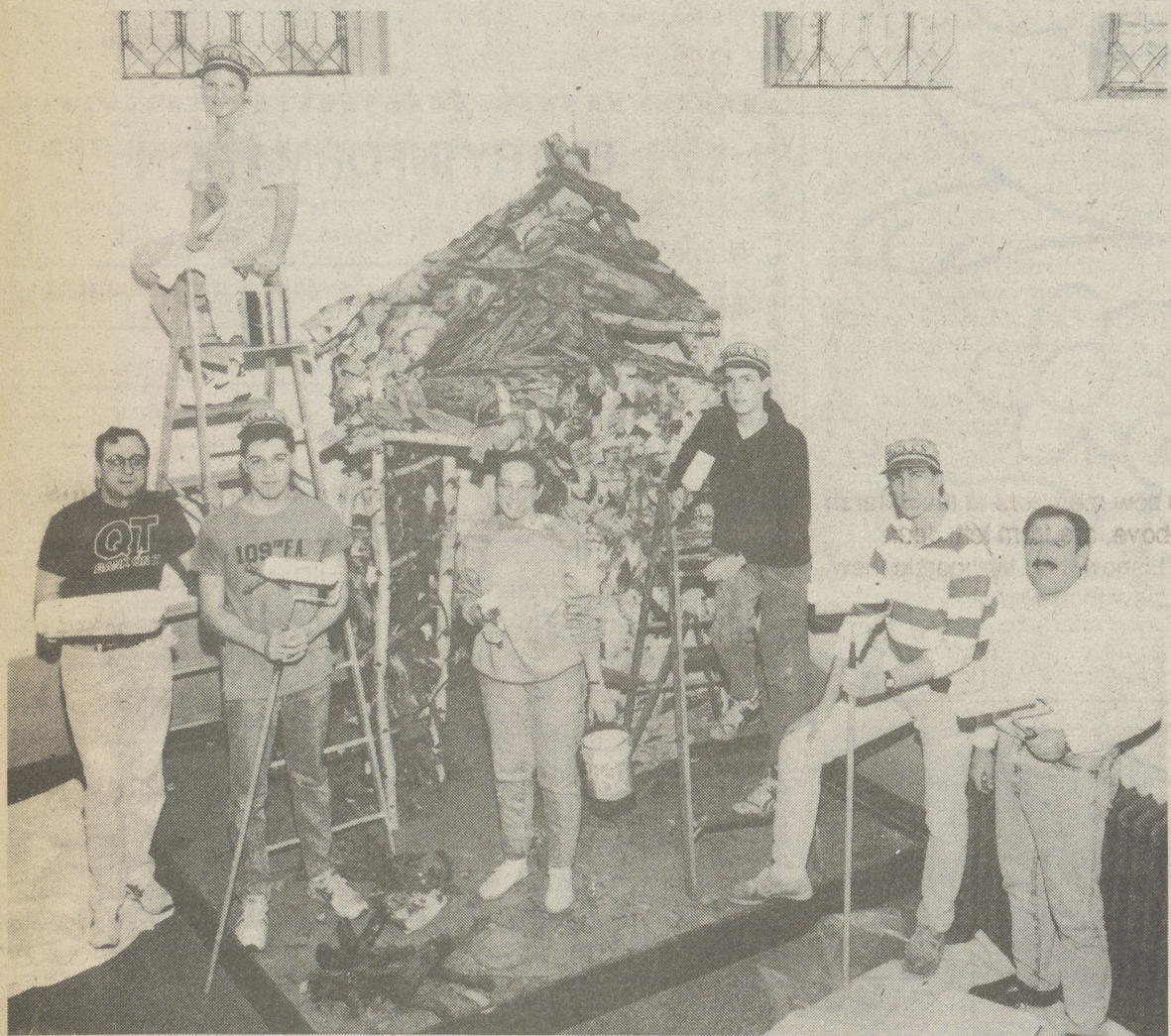
