Nesbitt Hospital Run/Walk scheduled for April 13

The Ninth Annual Five Mile Run/Walk, sponsored by Nesbitt Memorial Hospital, is slated for Saturday, April 13. Start time for walkers will be 9:30 a.m., with registration from 8:15 a.m. to 9:15 a.m. Runners and wheelchair participants will begin their race at 10 a.m. and may register from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Registration will be conducted in the Medical

A free Children's Fun Run will also be conducted at 10:10 a.m. Registration will take place from 9:30 a.m. to 10 a.m. and a parent or guardian must accompany the child.

Trophies will be awarded to first overall male and female finishers

in both the walking and running categories, first, second and third wheelchair participants, and first male and female Nesbitt Memorial Hospital employee in both categories.

Medals will be awarded to first, second and third place winners in each age category, and each child who participates in the Fun Run will receive a ribbon.

Overall winners will not receive medals in addition to their trophies.

Writers published in anthology

Four writers from the Back Mountain area are featured in "NPWC-ANTHOLOGY '90," recently published by the Northeastern Pennsylvania Writers Club. Deloris Selinsky and Beatrice Romanowski of Shavertown, and Marie Stolarick and Barbara J. Vivian, of Dallas, are among the 24 writers from throughout Northeastern Pennsylvania whose short stories and poetry are featured in the 100-page publication.

Ms. Selinsky has written a short story for the collection, entitled "The Tree". It tells the tale of an easy-going retired gentleman who is tormented by his domineering spouse. Most of her writing takes the form of poetry, as she has had over 600 poems published, including 3 chapbooks of poetry. "Reflections on a Lopsided World," "Thoughts in Shadow," and "Fragments of Yesterday and Now." She is vice-president of the Wyoming Valley Poetry Society and is listed in "A Directory of American Poets and Fiction Writers."

Beatrice Romanowski has contributed a poem entitled "National Cemetery, Pinelawn, Long Island, New York". She has had poetry published by "World of Poetry Press; The Senior Citizen Christian Newsletter," and other publications. She is a former president of the Wyoming Valley Poetry Society.

Marie Stolarick has written a poem, "Moja Mamusia". The title translated from Polish means, "my dearest mother." Her work has been described as "a moving affirmation of the bonds of maternal love."

Barbara J. Vivian has written two poems for the publication "Fiesta," and "Embrace." A graduate of Syracuse University with a B.F.A. in Fine Arts, she is currently a Realtor Associate with Century 21 Pool Realty Co., in Kingston.

The publication was edited by Loretta Zampetti and Michael Helferty, co-chairpersons of the Writer Club and Jim Spak, who founded the organization in 1985. The project was funded in part, by a grant from the city of Wilkes-Barre in association with the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts.

The club meets the first Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Hoyt Library in Kingston. Prospective members are welcome.

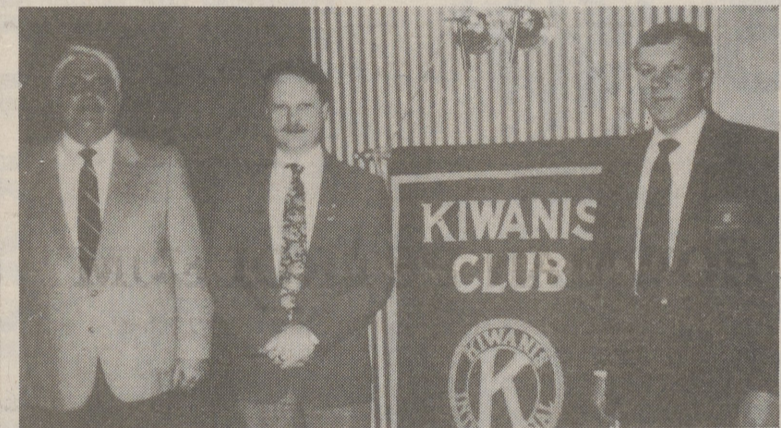
Conservation District has trees, shrubs on sale

This year we are also offering ornamentals, shrubs, a nut tree seedling, wildflower seed mix packet, and blueberries. The ornamentals are: Japanese White Birch, Red Twig Dogwood and Sergent Crabapple. Shrubs, red, yellow, and orange Azalea and purple, white, pink and red Rhododendron. Nut tree, Black Walnut. Blueberry Varieties: Blue Crop and

Blue Jay. The spruce, ornamental, and nut trees are sold in bundles of 10 for \$11.00, \$10.00, \$9.00 and \$5.00 according to species. Blueberries are \$5.25 each. Azaleas are \$15.00 for each.
