Black Knights field strong volleyball team—again

Perpetual volleyball powerhouse Lake-Lehman has the makings of an outstanding team again this

Lake-Lehman volleyball coach John Baranowski has a strong core group of players returning from last season with nine lettermen coming back, seven of them seniors.

"We have good potential," said Baranowski. "We have people with individual skills and if we get the right combination we will be competitive."

Returning lettermen from last season are Mike Doerfler, Ben Haughney, Brian Maruca, Chris Tawes, and John Turner, seniors; Paul Klemunes and Dave Knapp, juniors; and Brian Kelly and Rob Spencer, sophomores.

The Knights have won 27 straight league matches since being defeated by Tunkhannock on April 11, 1989. They are off to a good start this season having defeated GAR 15-0, 15-9 and Nanticoke 15-5-, 15-2.

Turner and Haughney, three year starters, and Doerfler and Tawes, two year lettermen will be starters for the Knights.

"We will play about nine people," said Baranowski. "Doerfler is a back row player, Turner, a great utility player; Haughney plays in the front row and can play defense when needed. Andy Santry is a bright spot coming off the bench with serving and defense. He hustles and is an intense back row

"We have a dedicated group of sophomores coming up and also some talented freshmen." Baranowski added.

The Knights Tournament will be April 4 and April 5 at the district's senior and junior high gyms. The Knights varsity team will play Saturday and the junior varsity will play Friday. There are 20 teams participating in the tournament which will start April 5 at 3 p.m., and April 6 at 9 a.m.

Teams participating in the tournament on Friday will feature local talent including Coughlin, Valley West, Dallas, Pittston, Lake-Lehman's two jayvee teams, Blue Ridge, Mountain View, Forest City, and Crestwood. Saturday will feature teams from the Eastern half of the state including Central York, Western York, State College, Easton, Emmaus, Wyoming Area, North Pocono, Co-Calico, Quakertown and Lehman varsity. Many of these teams are in the state's top 10 rankings.

In the 15 years since Baranowski formed the Lake-Lehman team, they have had 159 wins and only11 losses; have been league champion 10 times, district champs eight times and made the state finals 11 times.

After ending 1976 with a 3-6 record, the Knights finished 9-0 in 1977, and have gone undefeated in league play nine times since them.

Baranowski's assistant coach is his wife, Jeris Baranowski. Two former players, Chuck James and Dave Jachimovicz also volunteer their help.


