Kwak, a senior, and captain of the team, is off to a good start for the Colonels. He is hitting .283 with a team leading 6 doubles and 13 RBI's. He also has 1 homer and 13 runs scored.

A business administration major, he is the son of Mary Ann and Edward Kwak of Shavertown.

Cadwalader, a senior, catcher for the Colonels is struggling at the plate in the early going, hitting just .146 but he has scored a team leading 14 runs on the year.

"The league is tough this year with a lot of good teams. Nanticoke will be the team to beat in the southern division, I believe, and in the north, Dallas or Tunkhannock. We play each of those two teams once. As I said we will be in the hunt for the title," Ragnacci concluded.
