Application deadline set for May 1 for state scholarships

About 245 top-notch Pennsylvania high school seniors are expected to receive \$1,500 scholarships through the federally funded Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship Program this year, according to the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency.

PHEAA alerted students recently that they must apply by the May 1 deadline to be considered for the awards.

High school seniors who will graduate this year, who are Penn-

sylvania residents, and who have been accepted for enrollment in an institution of higher education are eligible to apply for the award.

The Byrd Scholarships are intended to promote student excellence and achievement by recognizing exceptionally able students who show promise of continued academic excellence.

Additional eligibility criteria and applications for the Byrd Scholarship are available in high school guidance offices or by calling

PHEAA at (717) 975-3320.

To be considered for a Byrd Scholarship the federal government requires that students meet two of the following three educational standards:

- Rank in the top five percent of their graduating class,
- Have a grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale (unweighted),
- Have a combined SAT score of 1100 (or a composite ACT score of 27 or a GED score of 289).

A letter of acceptance from an

institution of higher education must accompany the application to PHEAA.

Students also must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents of the United States.

The Byrd Scholarship Program is named in honor of Senator Robert C. Byrd of West Virginia whose long-term commitment to education was recognized by his colleagues when the program was created in 1987.
