Trucksville Nursery School slates preschool mini-camp

The Trucksville Nursery School, located in the Trucksville United Methodist Church will be holding Preschool Mini-Camp for children preparing to enter kindergarten in the fall. Sessions will be offered for eight weeks from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

There will be 12 children in each class with two teachers, and the cost is \$20 per mini-week. You can choose all eight weeks or any combination of weeks, but please register early for the sessions of your choice.

Registration must be completed by May 31. Please contact Linda Mazur at 696-3897, or the church office for more information between the hours of 9 a.m. and noon. The programs will change focus every week based on readiness skills needed for kindergarten.

Week 1 - June 25 and 26, Our Senses/Cooking. Children will be exposed to a variety of sensory experiences including: identifying and sequencing sounds, listening walks, identifying objects and environment through touch, and depending on sense of smell. All five senses, touch, hearing, smell, sight and taste will be explored with hands on experience.

Week 2 - July 2 and 3, Logic and Directions. The children will be involved in a variety of activities that encourage logical thinking. Activities will include games, science experiments, following directions, riddles and open ended questions to foster logical thinking.

Week 3 - July 9 and 10, Language/Puppetry. Language skills lead to confidence. This session will encourage talking in front of groups, participating and taking turns, patience and listening while other's speak. The alphabet will be emphasized through stories, skits and puppetry.

Week 4 - July 16 and 17, Small Motor Skills. The children will enjoy creative art activities designed to give them experience with the small motor skills they will need for kindergarten. Activities will include coloring, cutting, pasting, tracing, folding, and using a pencil.

Week 5 - July 23 and 24, Colors and Ecology. The emphasis will be on taking care of our environment as the children explore the colors of our world.

Week 6 - July 30 and 31, Building Self Esteem. This will be a positive, motivating, uplifting experience designed to make each child feel like a very special person. Activities will include body tracing, VIP duties and story building.

Week 7 - August 6 and 7, Position, Direction and Time Concepts. Understanding these concepts help the child relate specific events to the time of day, as well as are a vital part of learning sports, games, classroom activities and routines, and comprehension of materials.

Week 8 - August 13 and 14, Functional Movement. As this session builds body awareness, children will be involved in movements and exercises that include developing spatial relationships, following directions and free expression. Water paintings, scarf dancing and musical instruments will add to the fun.
