Area students take part in leadership program

Students representing Dallas Senior High School and Lake-Lehman High School participated in Junior Leadership Wilkes-Barre. Junior Leadership Wilkes-Barre, a community-wide leadership program for high school sophomores, juniors and seniors, conducted its fourth program year which consisted of six day-long seminars. During the course of the year, program participants at-

tended workshops that focused on: leadership skills; the media; human services; business and industry; the justice system and the environment.

The students also selected a project and worked in groups to develop a formal presentation which was given at a recent public forum. This year's projects focused on economic development; the elderly; the right to die; education;

recycling and recreation for handicapped children.

Junior Leadership Wilkes-Barre was the first organization of its kind in Pennsylvania and only the eighth in the nation when it was formed in 1987. Since its inception, the program has been used as a model for other cities organizing youth programs and the concept has seen tremendous growth nationwide.
