Eagle program to highlight Audubon dinner

The Greater Wyoming Valley Audubon Societies May meeting will be the annual dinner meeting to be held at the Ramada Inn, Public Square, Wilkes-Barre, on Wednesday May 22. Members and non members invited. For further information please call Jan Lohmann at 639-1112.

Al Ambler and Jackie Katzmire of Saylorsburg, Pa. will present an informative program about the wintering population of Bald Eagles in the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area. Research on the project began in 1983 when

Ms. Katzmire decided to determine whether the eagles were migratory birds or an actual resident population. Upon discovering the results that is in fact a wintering population, the National Park Service became involved and required to manage the eagles. Mr. Ambler has investigated areas within the park boundaries that are critical to eagle survival and will provide their needs.

The program will include eagle identification, on age classes, the criteria of wintering habitat and why the eagles have chosen to live

in the area. They will also talk about the history and daily activities of the Bald Eagles and the recent decline of suitable habitat. The ongoing project about our national bird and this country's symbol of freedom is a cooperative effort between East Stroudsburg and the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area.
