Lake-Lehman students place at district technology competition

On April 25, 26, and 27, 20 T.S.A. club members attended the state-wide competition held at the Seven Springs Resort in Champion, PA. The competition involved many different areas of technology related to a student's technology education courses.

These Lake-Lehman students qualified for the state-wide competition by winning in the district competition that was held at the Lehman Campus of Penn State University on March 8, 1991.

Lake-Lehman students competed very successfully in numerous events at the state competition. Of the 20 students who participated, 10 won individual competitive categories and two teams won group competitive categories. The state competition is divided into two levels. Level one is for grades 7, 8 and 9; level two is for grades 10, 11 and 12. The chart below lists the competitive event, level, the student who won and place won.

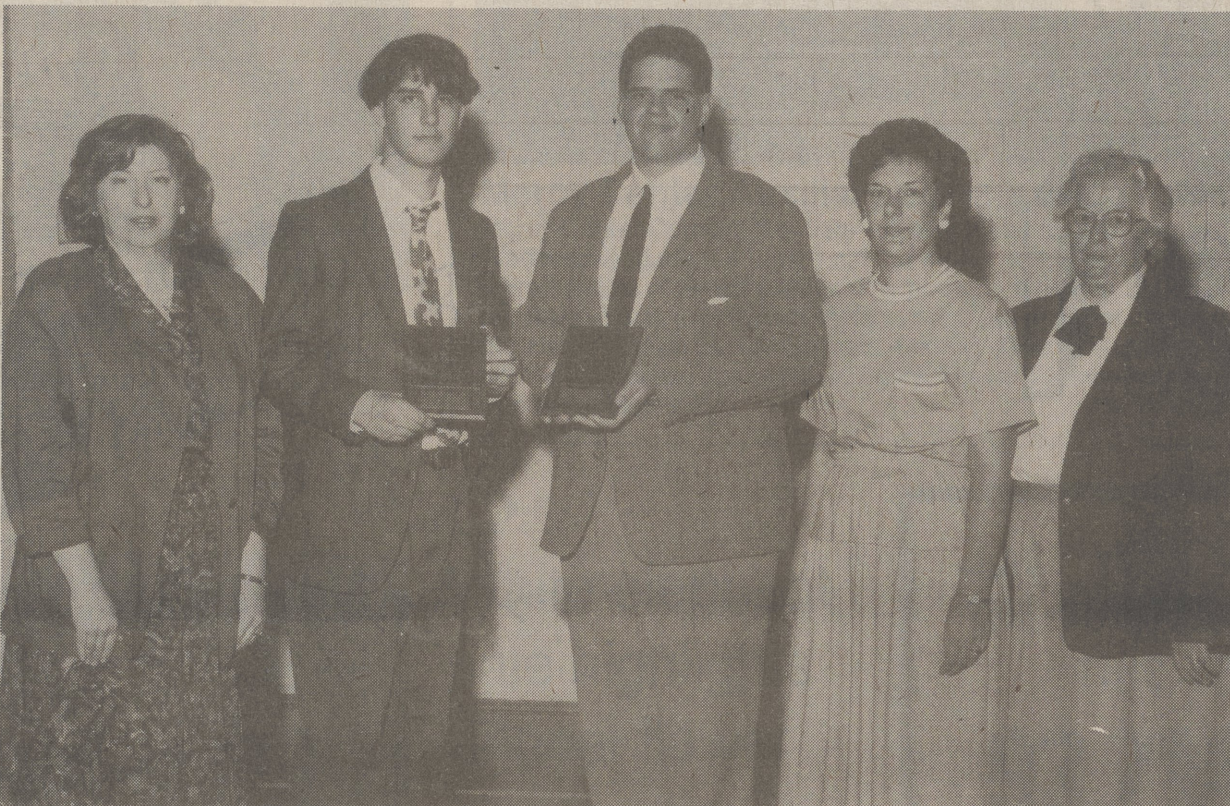

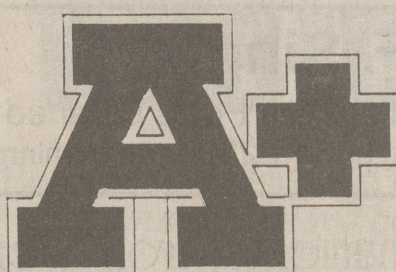

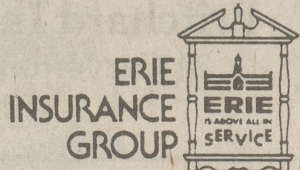
