**Women's conference slated for June 1**

The Seventh Annual Luzerne County Women's Conference will be held Saturday, June 1 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Penn State, Wilkes-Barre Campus in Lehman. This year's theme is "We, the Women of the World" and will feature guest speaker Elizabeth Dodgson Gray, environmentalist, artist teacher, theologian, author and mother of two children.

Among the sponsors for this year's conference are all the higher education institutions in the Wyoming Valley, labor unions, the Commission on Economic Opportunity, the League of Women Voters, NAACP, Chamber of Com-

merce, Junior League of Wilkes-Barre and the Wyoming Valley Council of Churches, to name just a few.

More than 60 workshops are scheduled covering a wide range of topics for all ages. They include "Women Artists: Our Poetry, Writing and Art," "Building Wealth Without Worry," "Are Parents Getting a Bad Rap," "Stress Management Through Body Awareness," "Safe Dating in the '90's," and "Women For Guatemala: Daughters of Corn," plus many more.

The conference will begin with registration at 8:00 a.m. The keynote speech by Ms. Dodgson Gray will run from 8:45 a.m. to 9:45
