## Dallas High School art exhibit set for May 31

This year's exhibit is dedicated to the return of the troops from the Persian Gulf. The students have constructed a 35-foot mural in the school cafeteria depicting The Gulf War. The ceiling of the cafeteria is adorned with red, white and blue mobiles done in a patriotic theme.

The art works displayed are in excess of 900 pieces including
