On May 16, the concert and jazz bands played a variety of music for the enjoyment of the Fine Arts Festival spectators in Wilkes-Barre.


Upcoming events include the Memorial Day Parade in Dallas and the final performance for the school year will be at the graduation ceremonies at Dallas.
