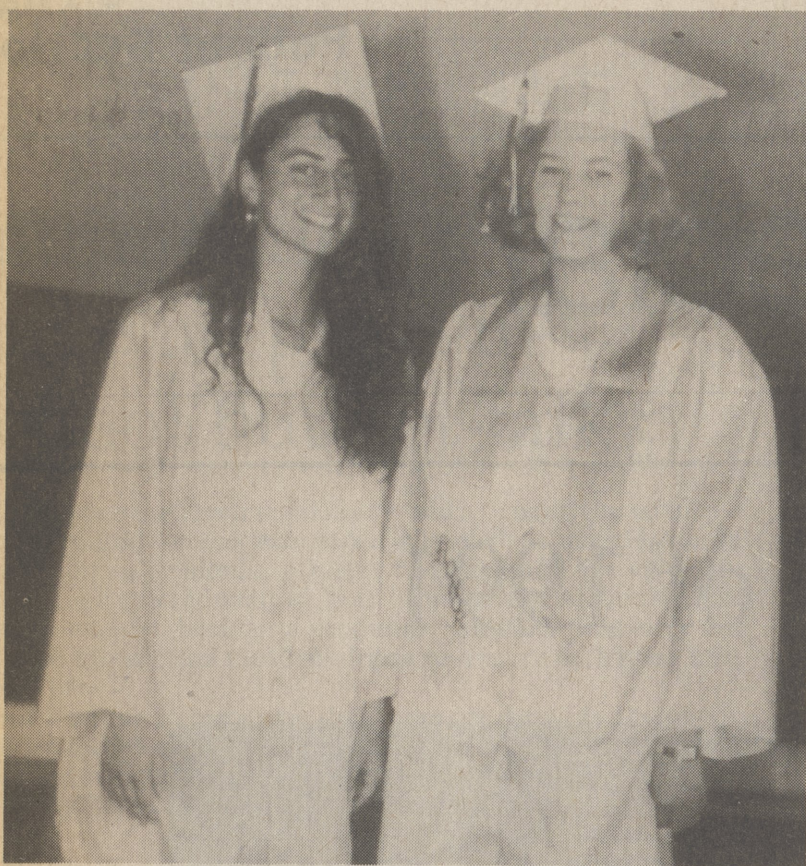

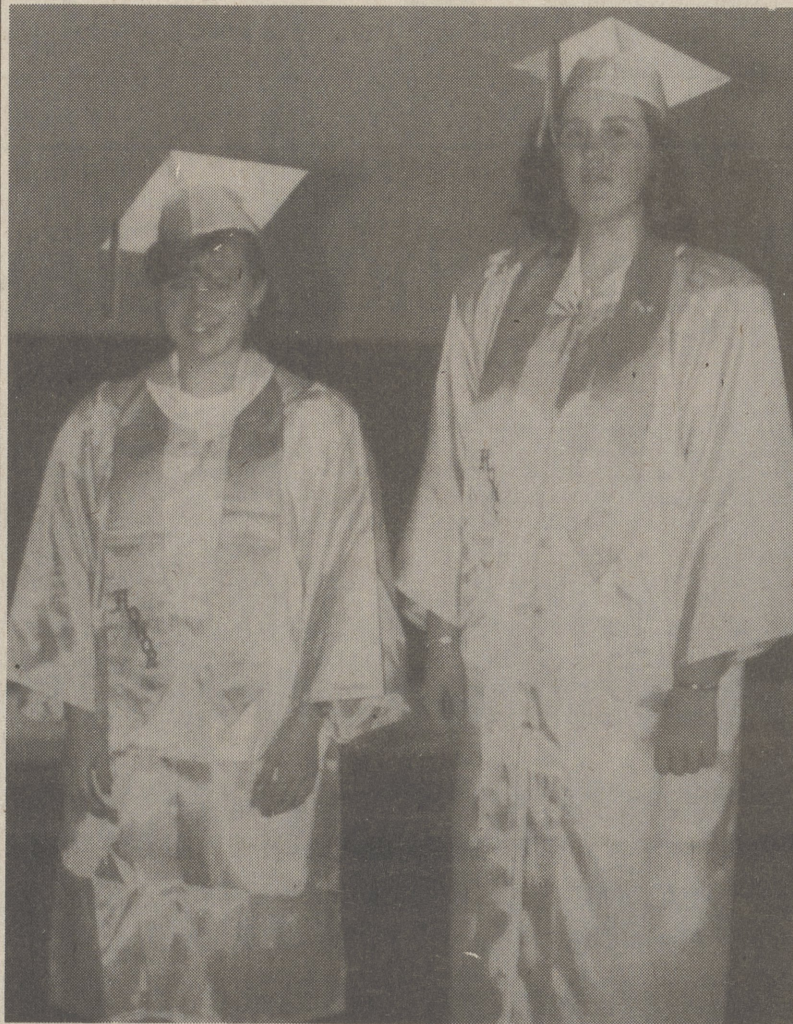
She plans to attend Wilkes University but is undecided about her major. This does not worry her because she has her

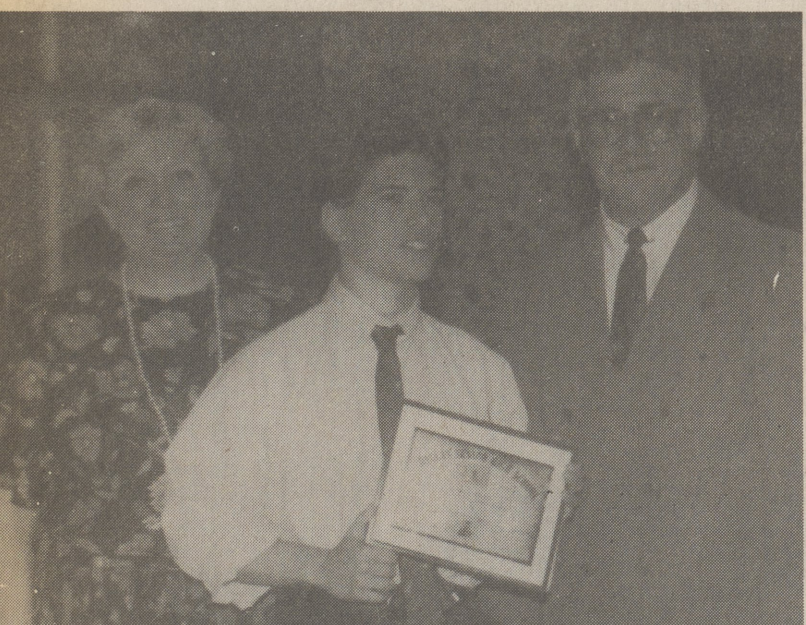
Since entering Dallas High School, Sylvia was in track and Loretta was a member of the

chorus. "Since we were here for only our last two years, we didn't have time to become involved in too much," said the sisters.

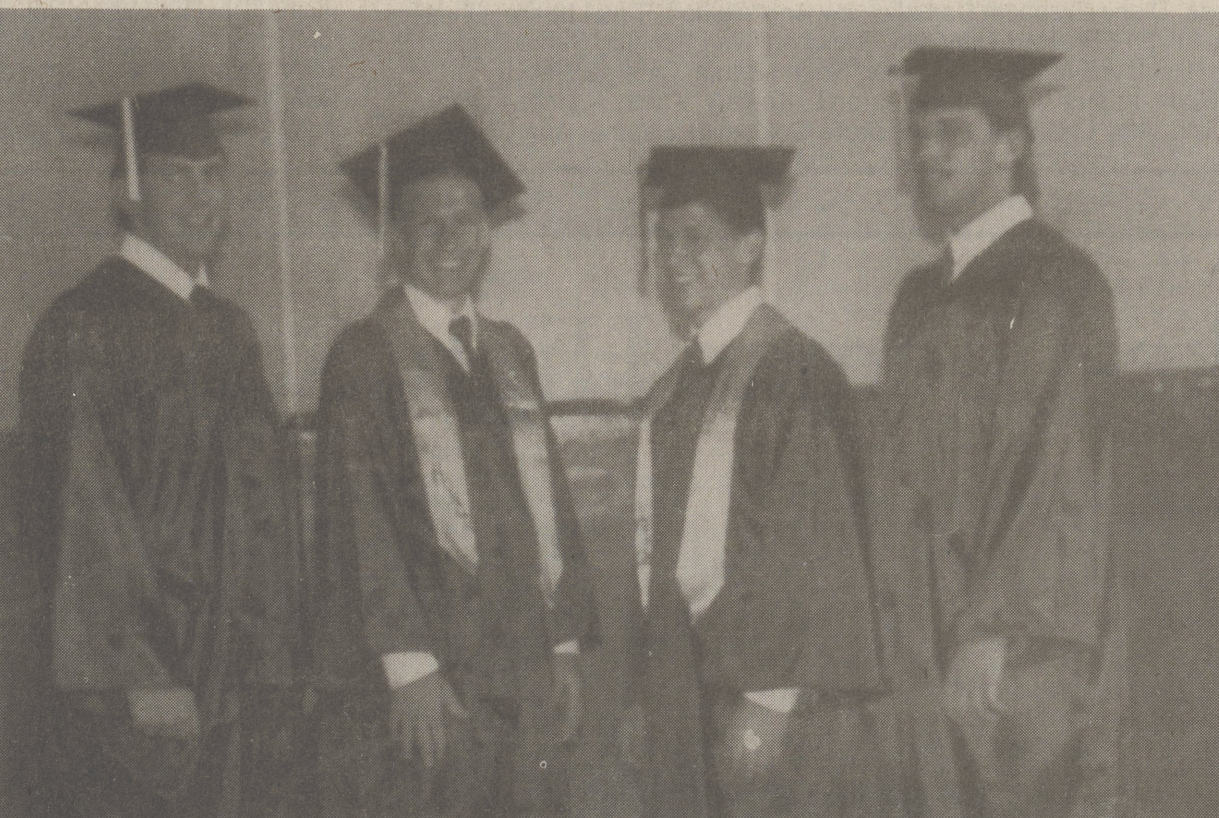
Loretta is going to Penn State and major in psychology while Sylvia plans to attend college and major in Hotel Management but has not decided which college she will attend.

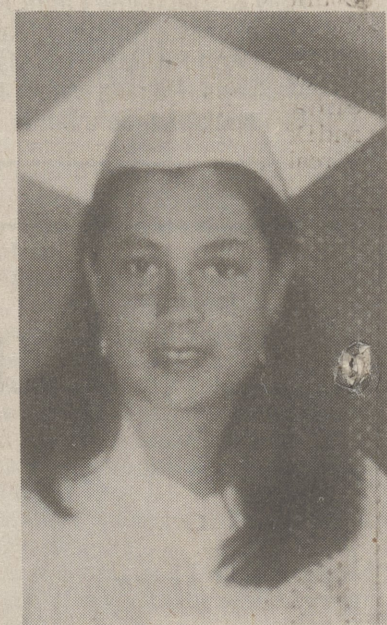
committee.
