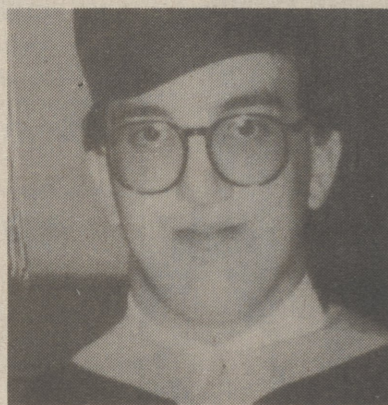
"I have enjoyed being a student at Lake-Lehman. The teachers are excellent and they give the students good and strong support.

Kornova twin brothers will continue education together

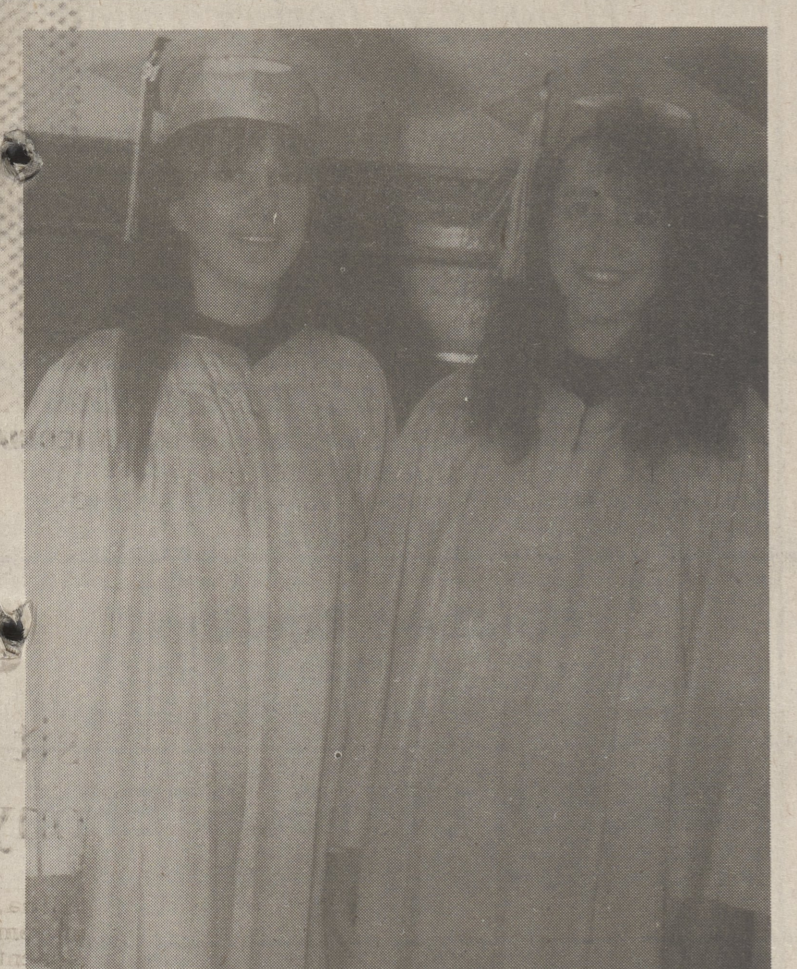

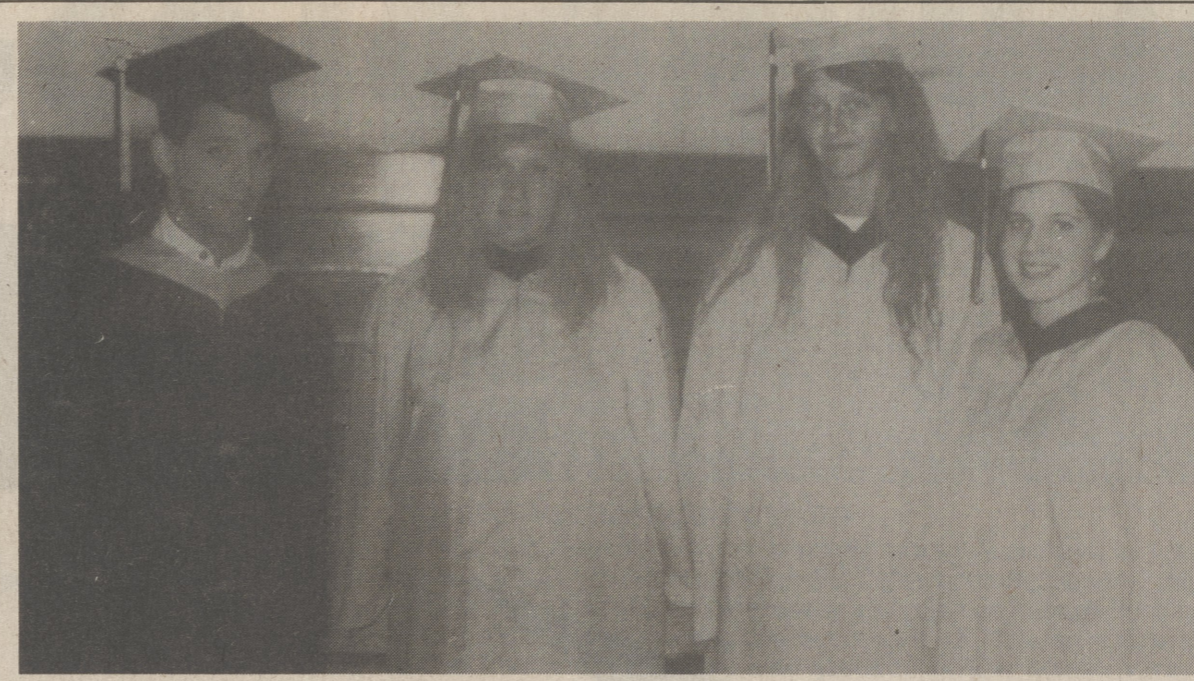
While attending Lake-Lehman Bonnie was basketball manager and Cheryl was a manager for the Black Knights wrestling team.

program. She also likes music.

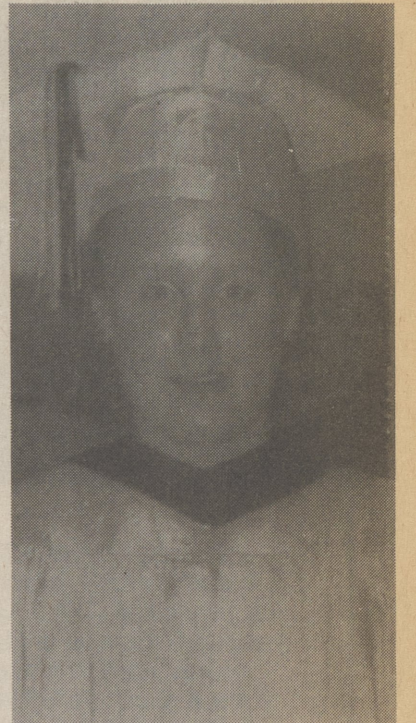
She is planning to attend the University of Maryland and major in sign language so she can work with deaf children.

She also received the Presidential Academic/Fitness Award, was chosen for the Youth Salute Program, vice president of the Student Council and a semi-finalist at the Governor's

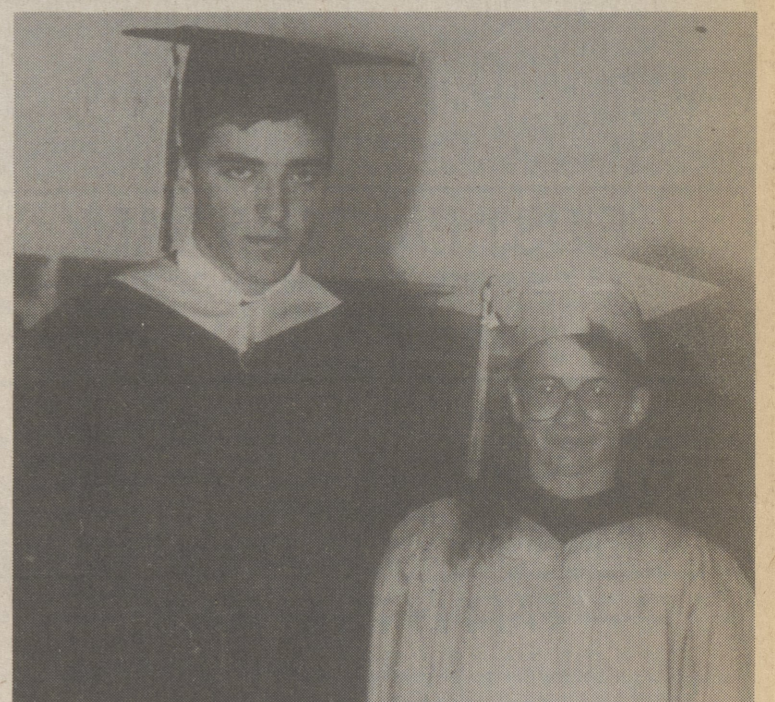
School for two years.
