

Recycling schedule for Dallas Boro, Dallas Twp. and Kingston Township

Danella Environmental Technologies Inc. has announced the pickup schedule for recyclable materials in Dallas Borough, Dallas Township, and Kingston Township. The new program takes effect July 1.

Recycling containers will be distributed throughout the area to all residences and each container will include a list of instructions.

The pickup schedule will include collection of garbage and recyclables in the areas as listed below. If you have questions about the schedule, call Danella Technologies at 1-800-552-8118. MONDAYS

Rte. 309 north from Kingston Twp. line to the traffic light at Center St. in Shavertown. All areas of Dallas Borough. Between Pioneer Ave. and Huntsville Dam Road north to south and Overbrook Rd. and Center Hill Rd. east to west. (Including Yeager Ave. loop and Huntsville Dam Road between Overbrook Rd. and the Jackson Twp. line.) Highland Blvd., Huyler, and Marabee Streets will also be included. In addition Main St. between Pioneer Ave. and Rte. 309 and Orchard St. between Main St. and Rte. 309 will also be picked up.

Garbage picked up weekly. Co-mingled recyclables picked up the first and third Mondays; Newspaper and corrugated cardboard picked up the second and fourth Mondays.

TUESDAYS

Main St. between Rte. 309 and Lower Demunds Rd. (Including Shaffer Ave.) Ferguson Ave. between Rte. 309 and Overbrook Rd. and Overbrook Rd. from Williams St. to Lower Demunds Rd. All roads in the Fernbrook section including Glenview Terrace and Maplewood Heights. Lower Demunds Road between Main St. and Hildebrandt. Rte. 309 between Center Hill Road and the Wyoming County Line. Lake Catalpa Road between the Lake and Hays Corners Road. Alderson Road from Hays Corners Road to Harveys Lake. Goodrich Road from Alderson Road to the township line, and Old Tunkhannock Road from Rte. 309 to the county line. Hays Corners Road from Lake Catalpa Road to Country Club Road. All of Spencer Road and Shrine Acres. 42nd St. from Hays Corners Road to the township line (including Meadows Ave.) Briarcrest from 42nd St. to Rte. 118 (including Goodman Ave.) Warden Place Road and Sgarlat Lake Road from Hays Corners Road to the township line. Stredny Road from Hays Corners Road to Rte. 309, Country Club Road from Old Lake Road to Rte. 309 (including Wedgewood). Irem Road from Country Club Road to Center Hill Road. Including Shrineview, Pheasant Run, and Fox Hollow.

Garbage picked up weekly. Co-mingled recyclables picked up the first and third Tuesdays; Newspaper and corrugated cardboard picked up the second and fourth Tuesdays.

WEDNESDAYS

Lake St. from Dallas Corners to Center Hill Road. Rte. 309 from the Dallas Shopping Center to Center Hill Road. All areas between Rte. 309 and Lake St. Including Old Goss Manor, Foster St., Woodlawn Ave., Mill St., Southside Ave., and Wellington St., Center Hill Road between Lake St. and Rte. 309 including Midland Drive and all side streets off Midland Drive. All of New Goss Manor and Orchard View Terrace. Hildebrandt Road between Rte. 309 and Lower Demunds Road including Conyngham Ave., Fairgrounds Road and Sedler Road. Lower Demunds Rd. between Hildebrandt and Demunds Corners. All roads between Hildebrandt and Demunds Corners north of Lower Demunds Road to Franklin Twp. line. Campground Road between Upper and Lower Demunds Rd., Lake Catalpa Road between Demunds Corners and the Lake. All of Upper Demunds Road, Applewood Manor, Glendalough Road, Rainy Tree Road, Goodleigh Farm Road, Fenwood Drive, and the Maples.

Garbage picked up weekly. Co-mingled recyclables picked up the first and third Wednesdays; Newspaper and corrugated cardboard picked up the second and fourth Wednesdays.

THURSDAYS

All areas of Kingston Twp. also Pioneer Ave. from Kingston Twp. line to Overbrook Road. All of Druid Hills including Williams St. and Wyoming Road between Kingston Twp. line and Hildebrandt Road.

Garbage picked up each Thursday. Co-mingled recyclables picked up the first and third Fridays; Newspaper and corrugated cardboard picked up the second and fourth Fridays.

FRIDAYS

Lake St. from Center Hill Road to Country Club Road including College Manor. Old Lake Road from Hays Corners Road to Rte. 415 including Haddonfield Hills. Rte. 415 from Twp. line to Center Hill Road including Lakeway Manor. Garbutt St., Gerald Ave., Bluff Pointe townhouses. Elmcrest, Rte. 118 from Jct. of 415 to township line. Yalick Road from Rte. 118 to Center Hill Road.

Garbage picked up each Friday. Co-mingled recyclables picked up the first and third Thursdays; Newspaper and corrugated cardboard picked up the second and fourth Thursdays.

will be used to achieve improved coordination in areas such as welfare reform, early intervention initiatives and a transition from Head Start to the public school system.

The program is also designed to help bring parents and teachers together, to provide families with assistance in learning effective parenting methods, and to hold workshops to assist teachers in working with families.

"The district has been receiving information regularly on the program on learning resources for young children, curriculum for preschool children, special funding by the department, language development, community helpers, need for quality programs, and many more," explained Davis.

"Lake-Lehman is already set up

for such a program with our full day kindergarten and the district can also adopt a half-day program. The Early Childhood Program includes such things as reading to the children, teaching them to listen, teaching them art, dexterity, and getting them ready to learn," Davis explained.

To help fund the programs for young children, the state will revise the formula it uses, shifting money from secondary levels.

"The governor's budget will take the current 1.36 weight from the secondary student and cut it back to 1.0 in funds and increase the weight to 1.36 for the elementary students. This can make a difference in many of the districts depending on where the highest population of students might be.
