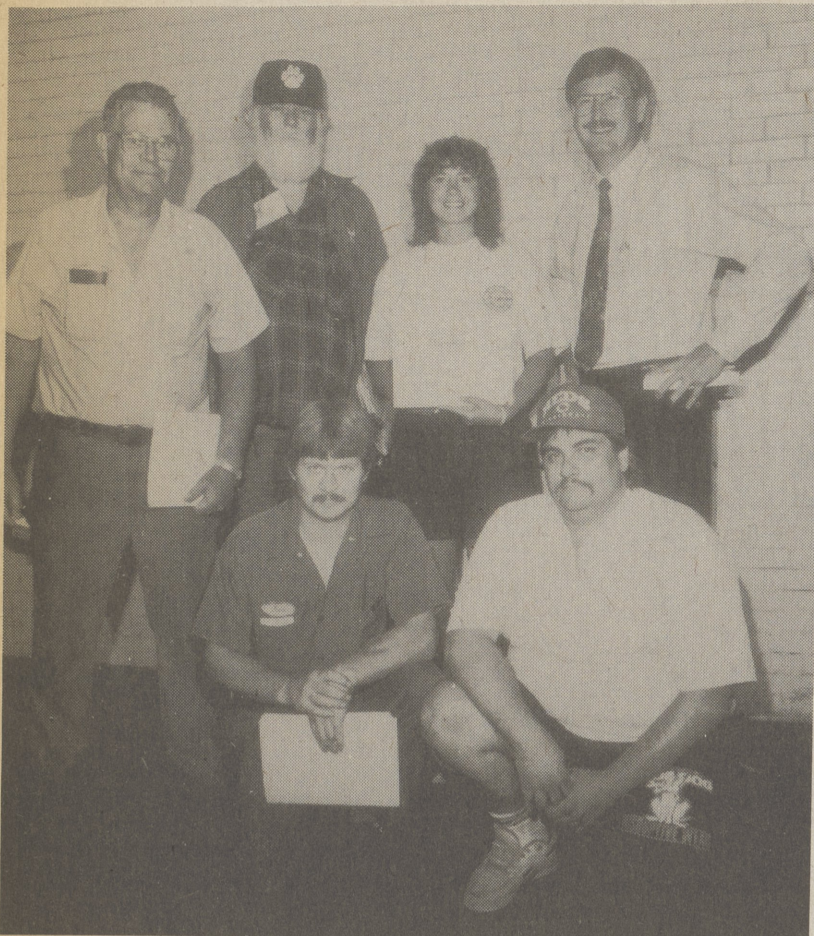

A 1988 graduate of Lake-Lehman High School, Lehman, he joined the Navy in November 1990.

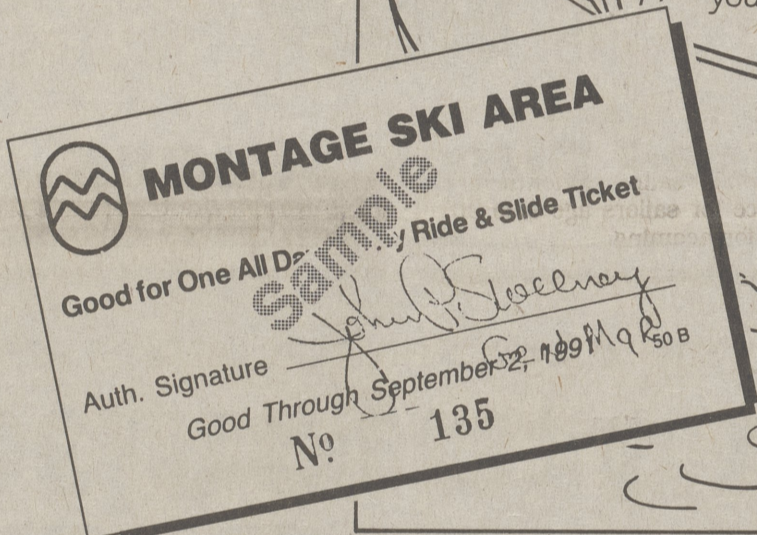
