## Back Mountain Legion wins playoff opener

Back Mountain Legion team defeated Hanover 8-4, July 22 behind pitcher Todd Paczewski to take the opening game in the playoffs. Paczewski gave up only four hits and struck out three in the seven inning game.

The local nine took a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning when Ray Russin hit a single, advanced to second when Pete Kerdesky took first on a walk and Russin scored when Chuck Finn singled. Neil Kaiser drove in the next two runs with a double.

Hanover scored a run in the top half of the second but the Back Mountain team put the game away in the bottom of the third when they scored five runs on a walk and five consecutive hits.

Sam Gorgone took first on a walk and Kaiser followed with a single. Eric Pieczynski and Paczewski each hit run-scoring singles to give the Back Mountain a 5-1 lead then Jesse Sorber drove

in two runs with a single moving the score to 7-1. Russin finished the inning with a single driving in a run and gave the local team an 8-1 lead.

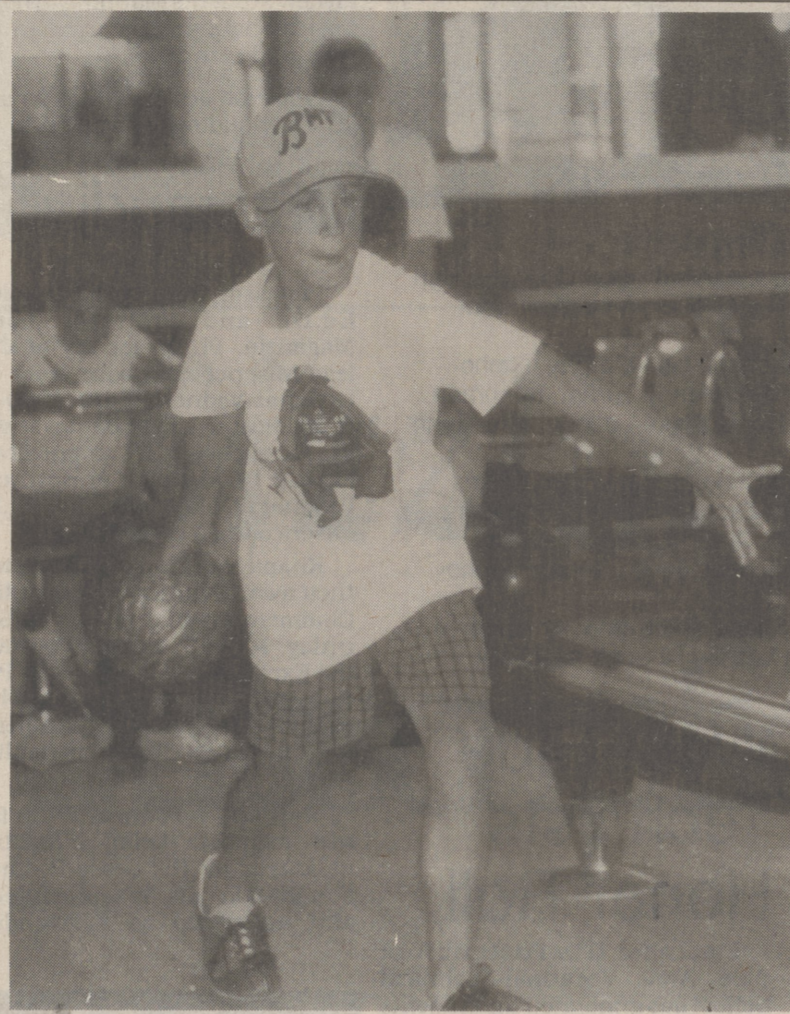
The Back Mountain played good defense turning in three double plays, the third one in the sixth inning when they stopped Hanover's three-run rally on double play from Russin to Pieczynski to Sean Showlin.

Russin went 3-for-3 at the plate and Kaiser had 2-for-3.

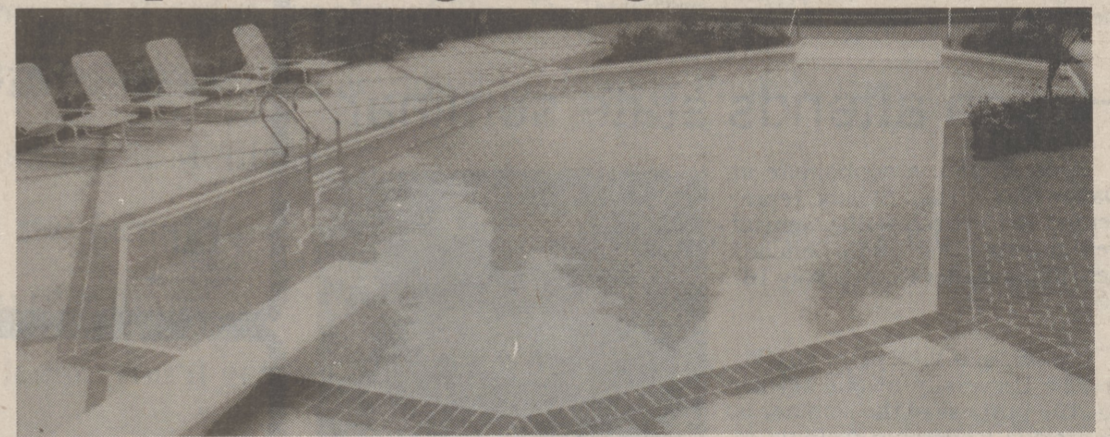

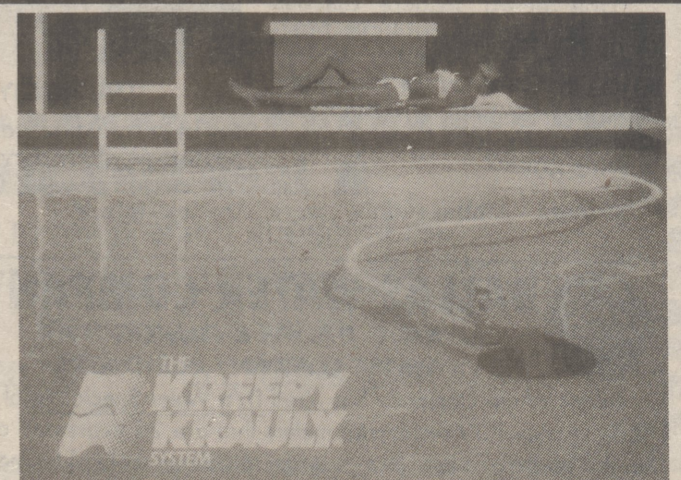
