Historical Society seeks flood memorabilia

The Wyoming Historical and Geological Society is seeking photographs and other memorabilia for an upcoming exhibit commemorating the 20th Anniversary of the Agnes Flood. Photographs and documents will be copied by the Historical Society and the originals returned to their owners. Credit will be given in the exhibit

which is due to open in March 1992.

The exhibit will cover many aspects of the disaster, including recovery efforts and after effects, according to Mary Ruth Kelly, Executive Director of the Historical Society. The Society is also working with the Red Cross to conduct oral history interviews of flood

victims and those involved in the recovery effort. The taped interviews will be used in a commemorative booklet and for the exhibit, and placed in the Society's Archives for future generations.

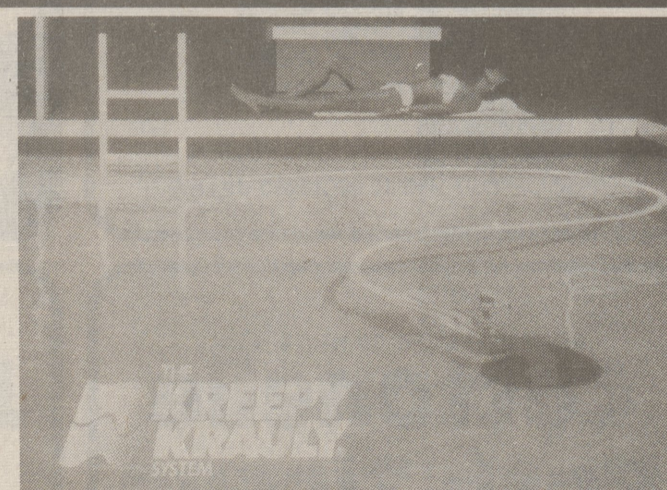
