Dale Campbell; second place, Dawn Blom; third place, Dave Hoffman.

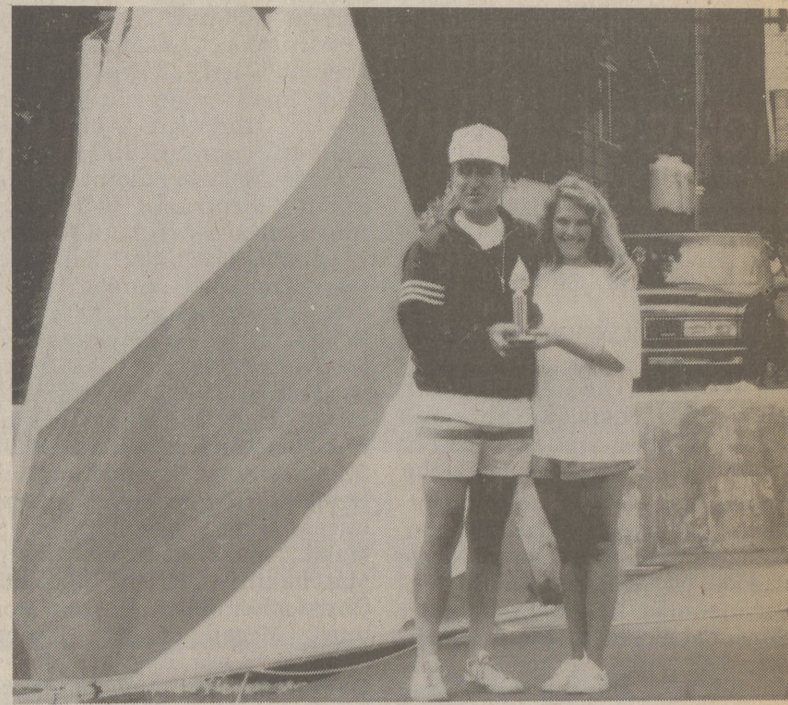
The Board Boat Trophy was sponsored by Great Bags.
