Troy Strauser plays in state East-West game

Troy Strauser of Harveys Lake is the first Back Mountain athlete to play on the East-West All-Star baseball team where he played second base.

A graduate of Lake-Lehman High School in June, Strauser was one of four members of the Back Mountain Legion team who were candidates for the East-West game. Ray Russin, Sam Gorgone, and Neal Kaiser were the other three athletes selected.

After being chosen by the Legion coaches, the four went through a series of four cuts with Russin and Strauser making it to the team level and Troy advancing the final step to play with the East team that won the game which was played at Hershey.

"It was a great experience," said Strauser. "It's something I'll never forget. I received a plaque and a shirt for playing in the East-West game."

After the game, he returned to the area to resume play with the Legion team which won the district playoffs and advanced to the regionals where the team lost after the third game.

We finished as co-champions with Hanover Area in the local league because we were tied and there was no time remaining to schedule a game to break the tie. The coaches decided the teams should be co-champs," said Strauser.

Strauser played shortstop in high school and the team advanced to state competition where it was defeated by Hanover.

"I transferred to Lake-Lehman from Mississippi where I played baseball and I played for three years on the Knights varsity team for Coach Dwight Barbacci," Strauser stated.


Troy ended the season with a .517 batting average, three homeruns, six doubles and 15 RBI's. He stole 20-for-20 bases and had a solid glove for the infield. He then posted a .394 average for the American Legion team, with 10 RBI's and five stolen bases.

"On the high school team in my junior year I had a .333 average, 14 RBI's and led in stolen bases on the team," said Strauser.

Strauser also played basketball, first in Biloxi High School in Mississippi then in his sophomore year at Lake-Lehman he played as small forward for the team. In his junior year, the varsity team advanced to the

first round in district play. He also played on the varsity football team in his senior year as wide receiver and defensive back under Coach Rich Gorgone

Troy is planning to attend Penn State Wilkes-Barre Campus then transfer to the Main Campus or to Old Dominion in
