 "We do have our line returning," Coach Jones said. "Molly Connolly, Tami Palka, Amy Shelley, Nina Mathers, Susan Richardson, Midfielders, Becky Yurko, and Megan Moran; backfield, Kelly Cleary, Kelly Janosky and Theresa Mathers."
 Jones says her players are growing into their roles and predicts that the league will offer close matches.
 "Our girls are improving each day but still need a lot of work. Our goalkeepers this season will be Ann Smaka and Abby Russin, both inexperienced. We are taking one game at a time and looking for individual improvement. We have had one scrimmage and will have two more before the league opens," said Coach Jones. 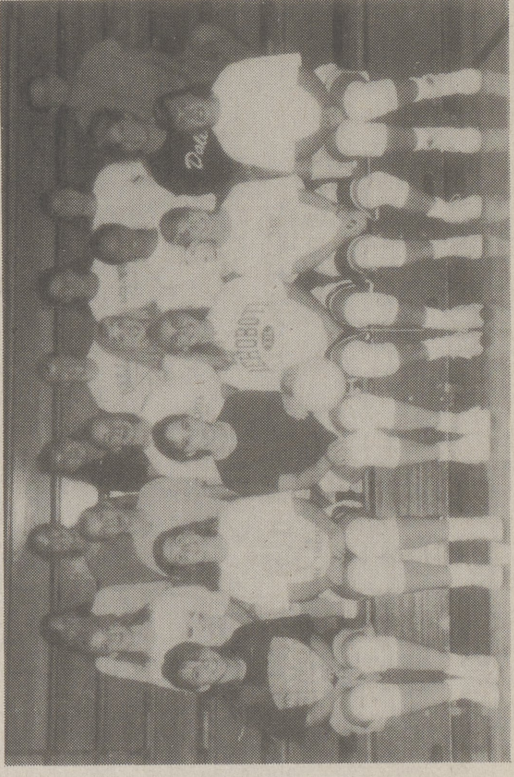
