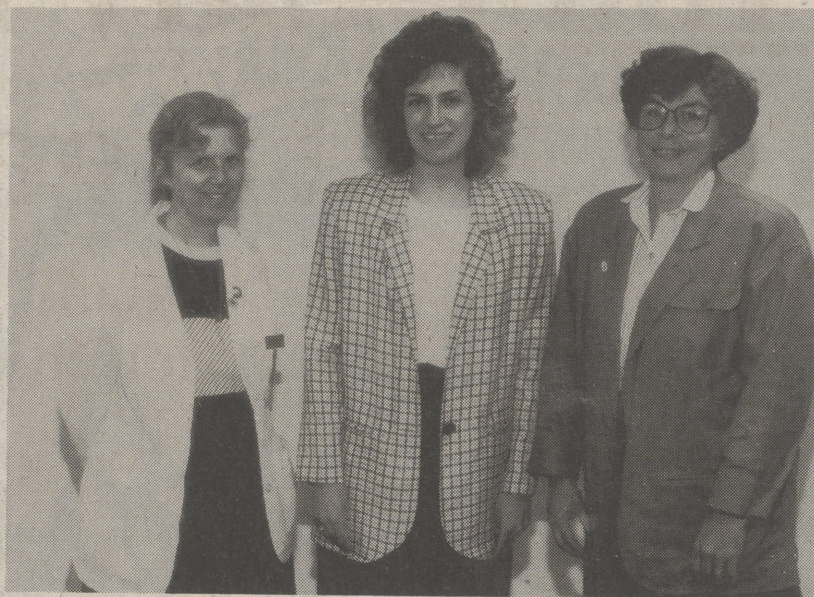
Mr. Kubasti is the son of Victoria Kubasti and the late Joseph Kubasti Sr.
