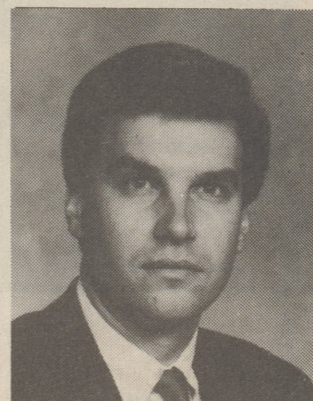


Trucksville Free Methodist Church christens a new name
