Lehman students learn about Native American life

Penn State University and Lake-Lehman High School are sharing knowledge and ideas about Native American culture. Dr. Fred Stefon visited Lake-Lehman's 11th grade American Studies class to teach the students about the significance of the voyage of Columbus and the Europeans who followed. Dr. Stefon is an assistant Professor of History at Penn State. He has a background in European History, but his work now centers around anthropology, oral and archival history, and educational policy, specifically Indian education.

Dr. Stefon spoke to the class about the true place of Native Americans in American History and how they were often cheated out of

it by the invading white man. He also told the students of many injustices wrought by the Europeans upon the Indians.

The lecture is one in a series of lectures for the American Studies class. The seminar began with a seminar attended by the students at Penn State University, Lehman campus. The seminar was given by Dr. John Grim, Professor of Religion at Bucknell. More events are planned for the class, including a trip in the fall to Bucknell University to attend another lecture. This series is to commemorate the quincentennial of the voyage of Columbus to the New World. In this exchange of ideas between secondary and post-secondary education, both the student and the teacher benefit.
