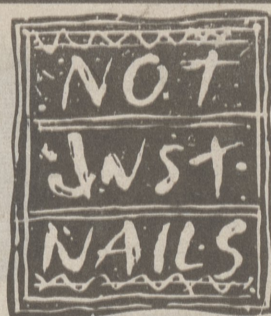
In her volunteer leadership role with the AHA, Bush will be responsible for the coordination of special events, the business campaign, telepledge events, and the special gifts campaign.

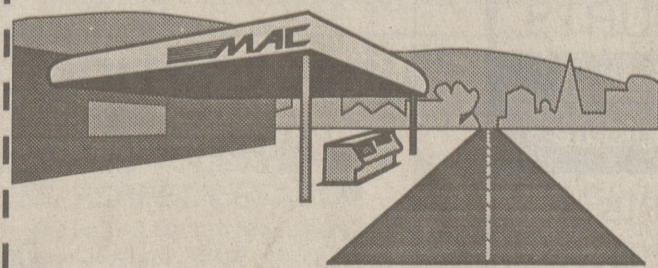
