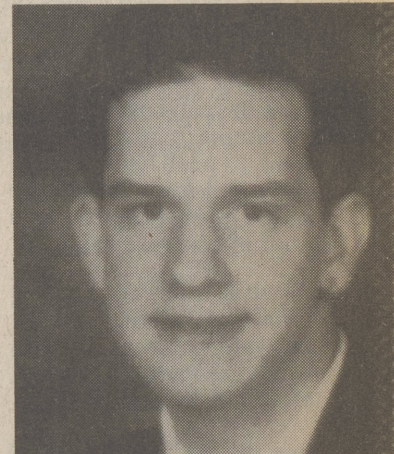
Westmoreland PTO holds meeting

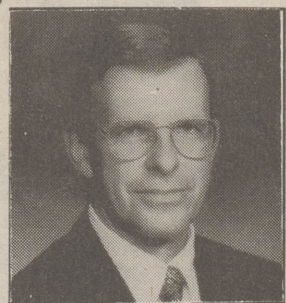
