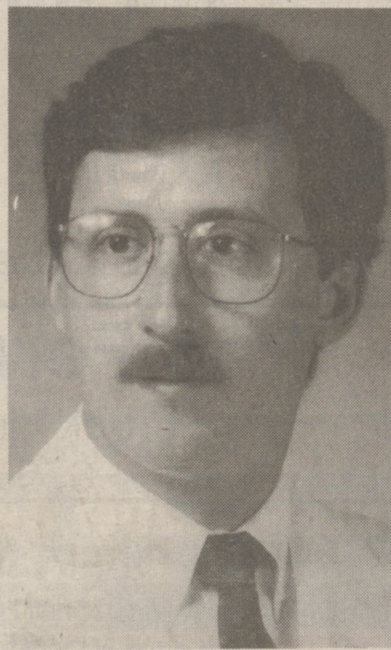
In presenting the awards, John

nursing perspective. The document will be published in a future issue of the Pennsylvania Nurse.

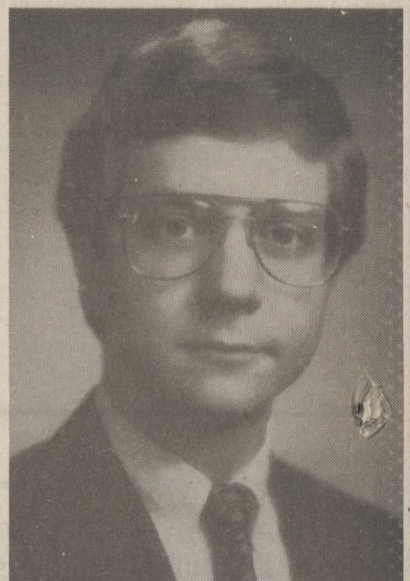

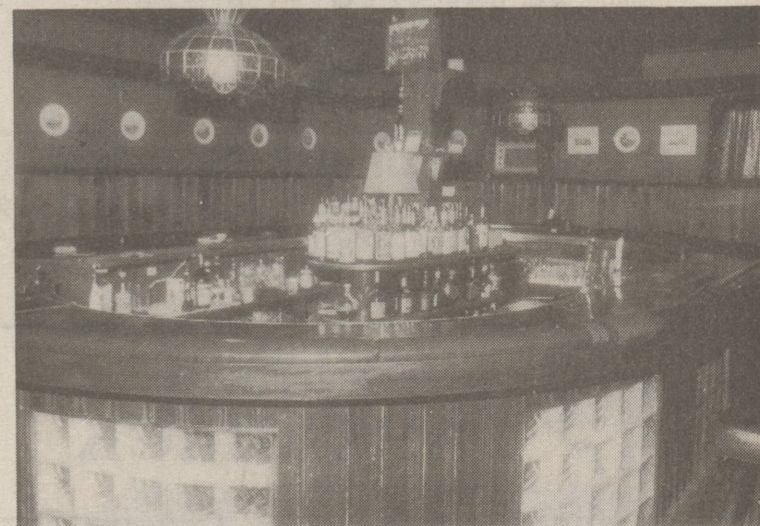
## "Quality is at the top of the Pine Brook's menu"
