She is also eligible for 1991 "Employee of the Year" honors. Tyler honors an employee each month for outstanding job performance and characteristics.

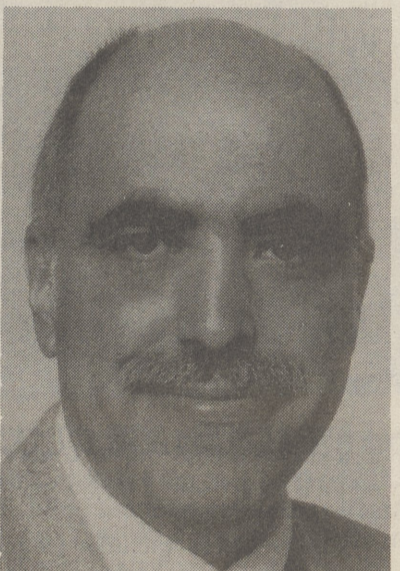
## Dr. Liuzzo published in 'Journal of Economics'
