Lehman alumni shares his experience as a journalist

Lake-Lehman's award-winning high school newspaper, **KnightLife**, received a helping hand this week from 1987 Lehman graduate Todd Krupa. Todd conducted a journalism workshop for the **KnightLife** staff reporters.

Todd stressed to the group of 40 students the importance of good writing and fair treatment of any story to a newspaper. He demonstrated to the young reporters how easily a reader-friendly paper could be produced. Most importantly he taught the staff members the basic six questions a news story must answer for its readers: who, what, where, when, why and how.

As a senior in high school Todd

was a sports writer/intern at **The Times Leader**. He then attended the University of Scranton completing a double major in history and communications, graduating magna cum laude in both. Todd received the J. Harold Brislin Memorial Award for Excellence in Journalism and was the Layout Editor for the University of Scranton's newspaper, **The Aquinos**.

In 1990 he took part in the Dow Jones Newspaper Fund Copy Editing Intern and Scholarship program in Fort Wayne Indiana and worked on **The News-Sentinel**. Todd is now attending the University of Missouri School of Journalism as a graduate assistant and is studying for his masters of arts in copy editing and design.

Mrs. Mary C. Tigue, Principal, announces that in conjunction with Catholic Schools' Week, kindergarten and first to eighth grade registration will be held on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, Jan. 27, 28, 29, 30 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the school lobby on the first floor.

Birth certificate, social security and Baptismal records are also

required; non-Catholic students need only present birth certificates, social security number and immunization records.

A non-refundable registration fee of \$100 must be paid at registration time.

Parents who cannot register within these stated dates, may call the School office 675-6566 or 675-2121 to make another appointment to register your child.

Prospective kindergarten parents may visit the kindergarten classroom on Monday, Jan. 27 from 9-11 a.m.

On Wednesday, Jan. 31, Gate of Heaven School will celebrate National Appreciation Day for Catholic Schools beginning with the 9 a.m. children's liturgy followed by an open house from 10-11 a.m.
