



### Dr. Bruns appointed to committee of National Academy of Sciences

Dr. Dale Bruns of Dallas, Chairman of the Wilkes University Earth and Environmental Sciences de-partment has been appointed to a special subcommittee of the National Academy of Sciences and the National Research Council to evaluate issues in the use of global environmental data bases.

Many federal agencies and international organizations collect environmental data for specific problems, but few efforts have brought the data together to focus on larger general global problems. The goal of this project, part of the International Geosphere-Biosphere Program (IGBP), is to develop better links with these agencies and conduct investigations of the impact of global greenhouse warming, atmospheric pollution and major changes in land use.

The National Academy of Sciences was chartered by the federal

government as a private, nonprofit, self-governing organization to provide advice on scientific, technological or public policy matters. The Academy and the Research Council both maintain their impartiality to ensure the quality and integrity of the studies they undertake, independent of political pressures.

Prior to his appointment at the University, Dr. Bruns served as a Scientific Specialist with EG&G Idaho, Inc., a national engineerial laboratory in Idaho Falls, Idaho

Bruns has published over 40 scientific papers and reports which he has presented throughout the United States. He has received numerous awards for his achievements in the sciences, including five EG&G Productivity awards and the company's Outstanding Performance Award for 1989. In addition to his participation in various workshops and symposia, Bruns also has organized and chaired several programs throughout his years as a professional.
