Gate of Heaven Altar and Rosary Society elects new officers

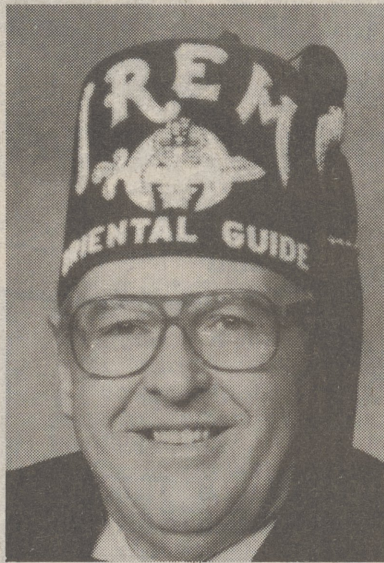
